**SUBJECT: AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CALIFORNIA YOUTH AUTHORITY AND THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO REGARDING PAROLEE POPULATION**

SUMMARY

On July 28, 1981, the Police Department submitted a report to the City Council advising you that the California Department of Corrections had proposed the establishment of a Community Correctional Center in Sacramento. The Police Department requested that the City Council submit a letter to the California Department of Corrections opposing the establishment of the Community Correctional Center in Sacramento. Subsequently, the City Council requested the Police Department to meet with the California Department of Corrections and the California Youth Authority to obtain a written agreement which would limit the number of parolees in Sacramento.

This report outlines the results of the meeting between the California Youth Authority and includes a letter from Pearl West, the Director of the California Youth Authority.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On October 8, 1981, Captain Hogan and I met with Chief Deputy Director Chuck Kuhl at the California Youth Authority headquarters in Sacramento. The purpose of this meeting was to advise the Youth Authority of the City's request for a Memorandum of Understanding that addressed the following areas:

1. To limit the number of parolees to Sacramento to a maximum of 10% over the annual number of parolees committed by Sacramento County.
2. To limit, restrict, or deny transfers for parolees that do not have verifiable parolee programs for the Sacramento area prior to being transferred from their county of commitment.

After discussing these requests, Mr. Kuhl advised that he would forward the information to the California Youth Authority Director, Pearl West, and that a written response would be forthcoming from Mrs. West after review and consultation with her staff.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION (cont.):


On October 21, 1981, the Sacramento Police Department received a letter from Mrs. Pearl West, Director of the California Youth Authority. The letter contained the following commitments regarding limiting the Youth Authority parolee population in Sacramento:

1. All parolees outside Sacramento County will be carefully screened to determine that Sacramento is the best possible placement.
2. Local law enforcement agencies will be contacted for input prior to the release of parolees from institutions.
3. The Youth Authority will periodically monitor the total number of parolees assigned to Sacramento County to assure that there is no unreasonable upsurge in out-of-area parolees.
4. The California Youth Authority is concerned for public safety and has no intention of flooding Sacramento County with parolees.
5. The California Youth Authority will continue to work closely with the Sacramento Police Department in screening and monitoring the total number of parolees residing here so Sacramento County does not have its unfair share of parolees.

Dear Chief Kearns:

As you know, my Chief Deputy Director, Chuck Kuhl, recently met with you to discuss placement of parolees in Sacramento County who were committed from counties other than Sacramento. As a result of that meeting, I have a good understanding of your concerns and I share them.

Before a parolee from elsewhere in the state is placed in Sacramento County, we screen the case very carefully to assure ourselves that this is the best possible placement. If the ward is being paroled from one of our institutions, we do, of course, talk to members of your department to receive their reactions. These discussions occur prior to an individual being paroled to Sacramento. We will, of course, continue these practices.

We also periodically monitor the total number of cases assigned to Sacramento County to make certain there is no unreasonable upsurge in out-of-area parolees. In fact, a recent study, when compared to one done earlier this year, shows there has been a decrease in the number of out-of-area cases placed in Sacramento. The two studies also show that a number of Sacramento County commitments continue to be placed in other areas of the state.

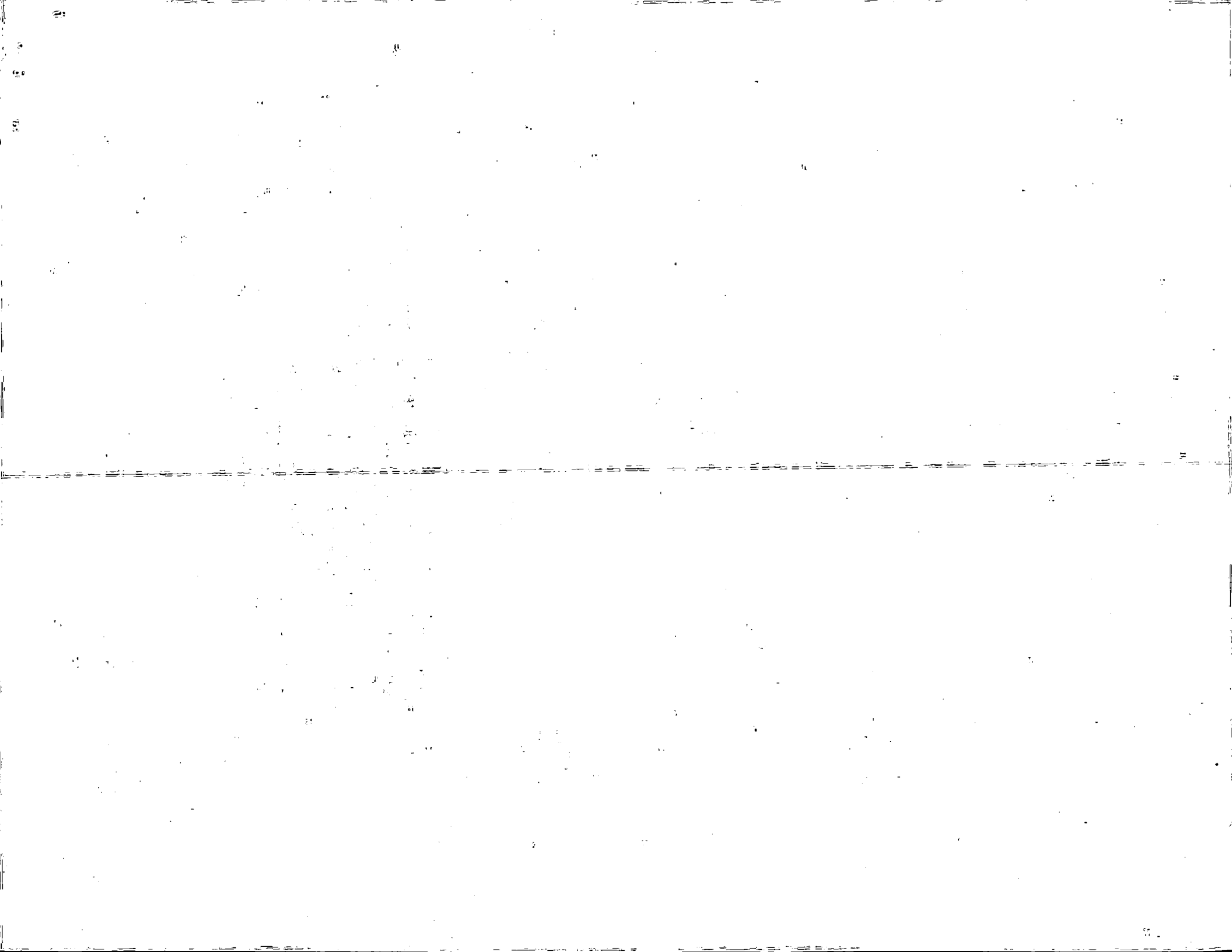
We share your concern for public protection; therefore, we have no intention of flooding Sacramento County with our parolees, since in the long run this would not be good for either Youth Authority parolees or the citizens of Sacramento County.

Your department and mine have a long history of cooperating with one another. To address your concerns regarding out-of-area parolees, we will continue to screen individual cases carefully, work closely with your staff, and monitor the total number of parolees residing in the Sacramento area to make certain the residents of this county do not have an unfair share of such cases.
