SUBJECT: Metropolitan Arts Division - Police Substation #1 Artwork

SUMMARY

This report recommends the execution of an agreement by and between the City of Sacramento and Juanishi Orosco in the amount of \$49,258 for artwork selected for Police Substation #1, as a part of the Art in Public Places Program.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On June 17, 1988, Juanishi Orosco was selected by a panel of arts professionals (Juan Carrillo, Joe Mariscal, and Harry Fonseca) to create two relief tile murals for the exterior of Police Substation #1, currently under construction in Sacramento. On July 21, 1988 the Art in Public Places Committee approved Mr. Orosco's artwork, and the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission subsequently approved it on August 10, 1988.

Funds for the Police Substation #1 art component will come from the FY 1988-89 Art in Public Places Trust Fund budget. Dependent on completion of the Police Substation, this art project is expected to be completed by July 1989. The artwork will be designed, fabricated and installed by Mr. Orosco.

An agreement not to exceed \$49,258 with Mr. Orosco for the Police Substation #1 artwork is necessary.

FINANCIAL DATA


City code section 2.59 (e) requires that the City expend at least two (2) percent of the total construction costs of qualified capital improvement projects for public artwork. The \$49,258 for this artist is a portion of the two percent artwork allocation for Police Substation #1. Funds are available in the Art in Public Places Trust Fund in FY 1988-89 for this project. The remaining portion of the 2% allocation will be used for administration of the art project(\$20,314).

No additional funds are necessary.

RECOMMENDATION


It is recommended that the Budget and Finance Committee review this report and refer it to the full City Council for action. Further, it is recommended that the Council, by resolution, authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with Juanishi Orosco in the amount of \$49,258 for two relief tile murals to be designed, fabricated and installed at Police Substation #1.
