SUBJECT: Resolution amending City General Plan and Colonial

Community Plan by designating a 4+ acre vacant site

as a neighborhood park on the south side of 17th

Avenue, east of 73rd Street (M-501)

### SUMMARY

The acquisition of this vacant site for development as a neighborhood park is proposed due to the increased residential development in this area and its distance from existing neighborhood park facilities. The Planning Commission and staff recommend that the City Council ratify the Negative Declaration, and adopt the attached Resolution amending the City General Plan and Colonial Community Plan.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City is negotiating for the acquisition of this vacant site for development as a neighborhood park. This site is currently designated for residential purposes on adopted City plans. The gradual infill residential development of this area, and its distance from existing recreational facilities, justify the proposed amendments. The attached staff report provides additional information regarding this proposal.

### FINANCIAL DATA

The Council Budget and Finance Committee has approved the amendment of the 1980-81 City Capital Improvement Program to provide funding for acquisition of this site.

### VOTE OF COMMISSION

At its October 16, 1980 meeting, the Planning Commission recommended approval of this amendment by a vote of seven ayes, the chickent, and one vacancy.

RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 1974 GENERAL PLAN FROM RESIDENTIAL TO RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE AND THE COLONIAL COMMUNITY PLAN FROM LIGHT DENSITY RESIDENTIAL TO PARK AND RECREATION DESIGNATIONS FOR PROPERTY LOCATED ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF 17TH AVENUE EAST OF 73RD STREET (M-501)

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Sacramento has conducted a public hearing on December 9, 1980, concerning the amendment to the General Plan and the Colonial Community Plan. Based on documentary and oral evidence submitted at the public hearing, the Council hereby finds:

- 1. That infill residential development has gradually increased the population of the area around the proposed park site;
- 2. That the development of this park site would eliminate a lengthy trip to existing City recreational facilities;
- 3. That the acquisition and development of this park site would encourage further infill residential development by providing a neighborhood amenity which is currently lacking.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Sacramento that the area described in Exhibit A is hereby designated on the 1974 General Plan as Recreation and Open Space and on the Colonial Community Plan as Park and Recreation land use designations.



### SUMMARY

The City is contemplating the acquisition of this vacant 4+ acre site for development as a neighborhood park site. Over the years, infill residential development has gradually increased the population of this area. The staff therefore recommends that the Commission ratify the Negative Declaration, and adopt the attached resolution recommending approval of the plan amendments.

### BACKGROUND

The City Department of Community Services is currently negotiating the acquisition of the vacant R-l zoned parcel for development as a neighborhood recreational facility. This area was initially subdivided into large parcels many years ago, but its population has gradually increased over the years due to infill residential development in the form of resubdivision of the original large lots, deep lot development, and development of vacant lots.

The nearest existing City recreation facility (Earl Warren Park) is approximately two-thirds of a mile from this site, and two others (Tahoe Park and Colonial Playfield) are over a mile from this site. The staff therefore believes that the increased residential development in this area justifies the amendment of the adopted plans to provide for this neighborhood park site.

The Environmental Coordinator has filed a Negative Declaration for the proposed plan amendments. This report constitutes the Planning Commission review pursuant to Section 65402(a) of the State Government Code.

## FINANCIAL DATA

The Council Budget and Finance Committee has approved amendment of the Capitol Improvement Program to provide funding for acquisition of this site during the 1980-81 fiscal year.

# RECOMMENDATION

The staff recommends that the Commission ratify the Negative Declaration and adopt the attached resolution recommending City Council approval of these plan amendments.
