LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

The 12th Street Maintenance District is located in both Council Districts 1 and 3. The district includes properties adjacent to 12th Street from "C" Street to "I" Street, as shown in Attachment A.

RECOMMENDATION:

The report recommends that City Council adopt the attached resolution:

Adopting the FY 2003/412th Street Maintenance District fees and amending the FY 2003/04 operating budget for district related expenses.

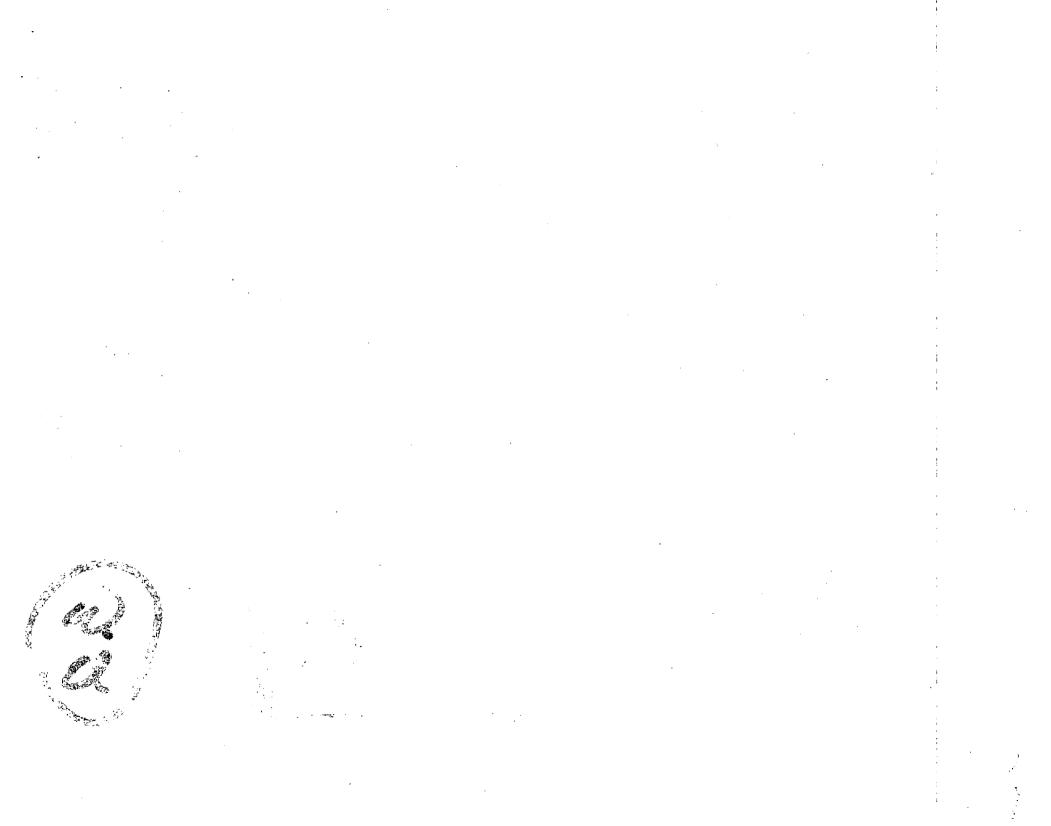
SUMMARY:

This report contains the budget for the 12th Street Maintenance District for FY 2003/04. Services include sweeping of gutters and pedestrian sidewalks, and landscaping maintenance. There is no increase in the annual assessment. The fees necessary to implement the budget represent a full recovery of costs for this district and are indicated on Exhibit B of the attached resolution.

City Council 12th Street Maintenance District Budget May 16, 2003

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On April 3, 1990, City Council adopted Resolution No. 90-245 approving the formation of the 12th Street Maintenance District. The maintenance services provided include weekly cleanup of gutters and pedestrian sidewalks, and landscape maintenance.

The current district includes 37 commercial parcels within a seven-service block area along both sides of 12th Street. The fees are assessed by front footage. The current annual fee for a typical 80-foot wide lot is \$118.

Annually, City Council is requested to:

- Determine the costs for the additional services provided;
- Determine whether the costs of the additional services shall be borne wholly or partially by the property owners within the area; and
- Affix a service fee to be charged to cover the costs to be borne by each property owner within the area.

In October 2002, staff sought input from property owners on their level of satisfaction and thoughts about the district services. In brief, the findings concluded:

- Low satisfaction level of current services.
- A strong desire for improved services rather than dissolution of district.
- No desire for increased days of service; again, better service.
- Primary service desired is sidewalk and trash cleanup; although, majority felt sidewalk and landscape service were equally important. Weekly power washing was also recommended.

Since the questionnaire was performed, Public Works Maintenance Services has installed a new contractor and according to City's inspectors, has performed satisfactorily. Staff will continue to monitor the quality of service and measure the level of satisfaction of property owners.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The fees levied are used to defray City and contractor expenses associated with the administration and services provided in this area. The proposed expenditures are fully fee supported.

The total cost of the 12th Street Maintenance District for FY 2003/04 is \$10,909 (see attached resolution). The total amount assessed to the property owners is \$118 for a typical 80-foot wide parcel for a total district assessment of \$4,862. The budget will be offset with \$6,047 from the projected FY03 year-end surplus of \$11,082.

An analysis of projected revenues and expenses indicates that the existing fund balance will deteriorate in less than two years if assessments are not raised. Although the original levy was approved at \$160 for an average size parcel with an 80' linear frontage, staff will seek a new vote by property owners in FY04 to raise the assessment. The original assessment is still insufficient to generate the necessary revenues to cover City services. Given the general level of dissatisfaction with the district weekly services, and the apparent unwillingness by property owners to raise assessments or dissolve the district, the proposal to increase assessments may fail.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATION:

Under the California Environmental Act (CEQA) guidelines, continuing administration and annual maintenance activities do not constitute a project and, therefore, are exempt from review.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

The annual budget process is being conducted in accordance with City Code Title 3.128. Approving the annual district is consistent with the City's Strategic Plan in preserving and enhancing the City's neighborhoods and quality of life.

ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:

City Council adoption of the attached resolution is not affected by City policy related to ESBD.

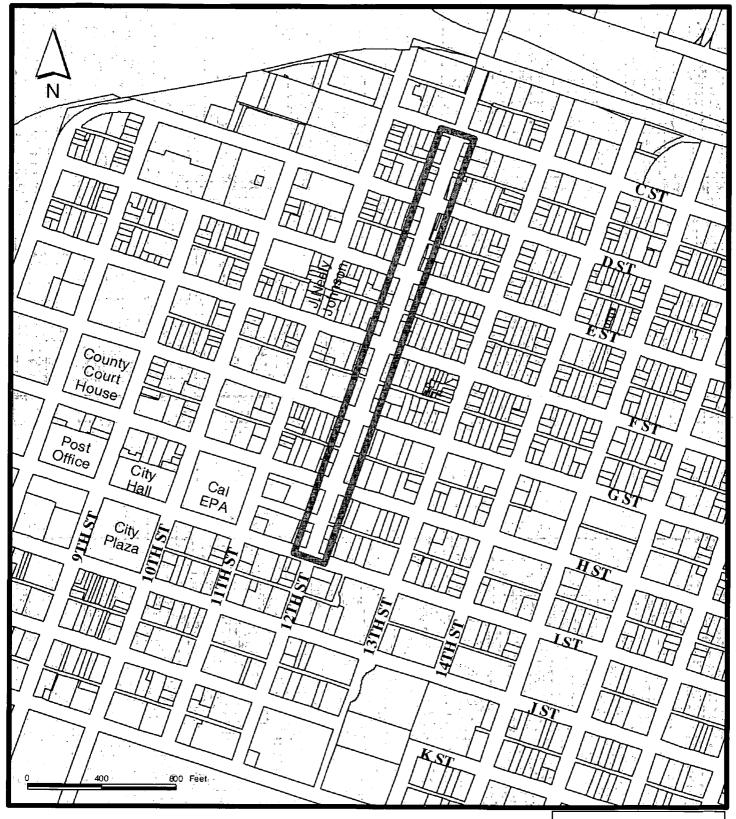

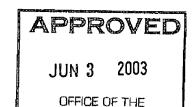
