

ORDINANCE NO. 670, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 78 OF ORDINANCE NO. 18, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED SEPTEMBER 22, 1921, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE CARRYING ON OF CERTAIN PROFESSIONS, TRADES, CALLINGS AND OCCUPATIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND MAKING THIS AN EMERGENCY MEASURE, TO TAKE EFFECT OCTOBER 1ST, 1921.", REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 654, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED APRIL 25, 1935, AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. Section 78 of Ordinance No. 18, Fourth Series, passed September 22, 1921, is hereby amended to read as follows:

RESTAURANTS:

SECTION 78. For every person, firm or corporation conducting, managing or carrying on the business of caterer or restaurant, or other place where meals or luncheons are served to be consumed upon the premises, the gross receipts of which business amounts to:

\$5,000 or less per quarter, \$15.00 per quarter.
\$5,001 and less than \$12,500 per quarter, \$21.00 per quarter;
\$12,501 and up per quarter, \$24.00 per quarter.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 654, Fourth Series, passed April 25, 1935, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure to take effect immediately. Said emergency is hereby declared to be the necessity of providing a license fee for restaurants because of the repeal of Ordinance No. 654, Fourth Series.
