Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: On July 17, 2025, California Task Force Seven (CA-TF7) US&R Task Force (Other) representatives were activated by the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA). As the sponsoring agency for CA-TF7 Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) program, the City of Sacramento (Fire Department) is responsible for providing trained personnel to staff positions on federal task force teams and incident support teams, and as a result of this deployment, the City must sign the DHS/FEMA Assistance Award/Amendment contracts (EMW-2023-CA-USR-0008, Amendment M021) in the amount of \$42,000 to receive reimbursement for costs associated with deployment activities.

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Policy Considerations: Acceptance of the federal US&R funding is consistent with City Council action relative to state and federal grant awards.

Economic Impacts: None.

Environmental Considerations: Ongoing administrative maintenance activities, such as purchases of supplies, equipment, or materials that are not made for purposes of a public construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b) (3), 15378(b) (2).

Sustainability: There are no sustainability considerations applicable to the acceptance of federal funding reimbursing DHS/FEMA-directed activities.

Commission/Committee Action: Not applicable.

Rationale for Recommendation: DHS/FEMA Assistance Award/Amendment contract (EMW-2023-CA-USR-0008, Amendment M021) in the amount of \$42,000 must be signed and submitted to DHS/FEMA to receive reimbursement for costs associated with the Texas Flood.

Financial Considerations: As the sponsoring agency, the City of Sacramento incurs costs related to the activation of the CA-TF7 US&R Team; and DHS/FEMA reimburses expenses directly related to these deployment activities. These amendments allow DHS/FEMA to obligate \$42,000 of federal funds to cover labor and equipment expenses incurred by the City for activities associated with the Texas Flood. Staff recommends the CA-TF7 US&R Team Texas Flood operating grant project (G12706500) be established with revenue and expenditure budgets in the amount \$42,000 in the Operating Grant Fund (Fund 2702).

GRANT/AGREEMENT: CALIFORNIA TASK FORCE SEVEN (CA-TF7) URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE (US&R) TEAM'S TEXAS FLOOD (G12706500)

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento Fire Department has been the sponsoring agency for the CA-TF7 US&R Team since the inception of the Federal Urban Search & Rescue program in the early 1990's. CA-TF7 has responded with emergency assistance to the 2001 terrorist attack on the World Trade Center in New York City, to the Gulf Coast in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina in 2005, to the fatal Oso Washington mudslides of 2014, and various other events to the present.
- B. CA-TF7 can be deployed as an entire team, or individual Incident Support Team (IST) members, to provide overhead support to man-made and natural disasters as well as national special security events.
- C. On July 17, 2025, CA-TF7 US&R Task Force (Other) representatives were activated by the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) for deployment to Texas Flood.
- D. To receive reimbursement for costs associated with the deployment activities for the Texas Flood deployment, the City must pass a resolution granting signature authority for the Interim City Manager, or designee, to sign Amendment M021 regarding DHS/FEMA Assistance Award/Amendment No. EMW-2023-CA-USR-0008.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Interim City Manager or designee, including the Fire Chief, is authorized to execute Amendment M021 to DHS/FEMA Assistance Award/Amendment No. EMW-2023-CA-USR-0008.
- Section 2. The Interim City Manager or designee, including the Fire Chief, is authorized to accept the federal funding for CA-TF7 US&R Team in the amount of \$42,000 for Amendment M021.
- Section 3. An operating grant shall be established for the CA-TF7 US&R Team Texas Flood Deployment (G12706500).
- Section 4. A revenue and expenditure budget in the amount of \$42,000 shall be

established for the CA-TF7 US&R Texas Flood Deployment (G12706500) in the operating grant fund (Fund 2702).
