SUBJECT: Sacramento Community Center Concessions Contract

SUMMARY ...

The exclusive contract for food and beverage at the Sacramento Community/ Convention Center currently held by Volume Services, Interstate United, will expire June 29, 1980.

The City of Sacramento must decide whether to re-negotiate the contract which is currently held by Volume Services, Interstate United, or to put this contract out to bid.

It is this staff's recommendation that we re-negotiate the contract with Volume Services, Interstate United.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Prior to the opening of the Community Center in 1974, the City of Sacramento solicited proposals for the food and beverage concessions sold on an individual basis in the Community Center and Memorial Auditorium. (This was not the catering of dinners contract.) The City received six bid proposals and a committee composed of the Community Center Manager, Finance Director, City Purchasing Agent, Assistant City Attorney and a representative of the City Manager's Office evaluated the proposals. It was the conclusion of this committee to select Volume Services, which had the third highest bid. The two highest bids were rejected as being so high it would be impossible for them to perform. Mayor and Council voted to allow Community Center management to negotiate with Volume Services to increase their bid

By the City Chejr proposal was raised to 35% from 32%. It was recommended that this figure be office of the Caccepted. On June 6, 1974, Mayor and Council voted (Resolution No. 74-254) to accept the 35% on a three-year contract with a three-year option.

In 1977 Volume Services took the three-year option and has been the only exclusive food and beverage concessionaire since the Community/Convention Center opened. This exclusive food and beverage contract will expire June 29, 1980, and the City now has the option of renewing the contract with Volume Services, or soliciting for new bids.

Alternatives:

- (1) Re-bid contract:
 - <u>Pros</u>: (a) City could receive a higher percentage (each percentage point constitutes approximately (\$3,500.00) thirty-five hundred dollars.
 - (b) City could demand and receive a better capital investment by highest bidder. (The last bid specified that this was a consideration when bids were evaluated.)
 - Cons: (a) There is a possibility that in the bidding process all bids would come in lower than our present 35%.
 - (b) Capital investment could be smaller than we presently have.
 - (c) If Volume Services was not the high bidder and another company was selected there could be a break in our service of alcoholic beverages.
- (2) Extension of Volume Service Contract: <u>Pros</u>: (a) We now have a very favorable percentage (see FINANCIAL DATA).
 - (b) Continuity of service.
 - (c) Reinvestment in capital.

<u>Cons</u>: (a) Potential of percentage loss.

(b) Potential loss of capital improvement.

The above is a comparison of different contracts of west coast facilities. The two facilities in this district that are not included are (1) San Jose, where

their Convention Center has a total contract for 14% on catering and 36% on concessions; (2) the Oakland Coliseum, which has a volume of over three million dollars gross with a contract for 37.5%.
