Subject: Metropolitan Arts Division - Request for Appropriation Increase for Friends of the Arts Commission

SUMMARY

This report recommends a \$1,950 increase in the FY1982-83 budget of the Metropolitan Arts Division to reflect the receipt of a donation from the Friends of the Arts Commission.

BACKGROUND

On September 16, 1982 the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission received a contribution of \$1,950 from Friends of the Arts Commission for support of the Technical Assistance Program. The current program provides:

- arts management workshops
- one-on-one consultancies to artists and arts groups
- four mini conferences throughout the region focusing on survival as an independent, individual artist and how organizations can best provide services to artists.
- a centrally located resource center with arts-related publications, slide, video, and audio collections of arts related topics, as well as a trunk containing selected arts and arts management publications which will travel throughout the region.
- an informational and referral service to artists, arts organizations and the general public through its offices, arts hotline and staff assistance.

The Friends of the Arts Commission was established in December, 1981. It is a private, non-profit public benefit corporation comprised of a seven-member board with an unlimited membership of individuals and corporations. The purpose of the organization is to promote and support the activities and programs of the Arts Commission by:

1. stimulating corporate and individual funding
2. advocating for increased local government support of the arts; and
3. sponsoring fundraising events for the benefit of SMAC.

The Friends of the Arts Commission's donation will go toward support for staff time to conduct one-on-one consultancies with arts organizations.

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CITY BUDGET FOR FY 1982-83
FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICES
(METROPOLITAN ARTS DIVISION - FRIENDS OF THE ARTS COMMISSION'S DONATION
FOR TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM)

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. That receipt of a donation from Friends of the Arts Commission in support of the Technical Assistance Program requires an appropriation increase of \$1,950 to the budget of the Department of Community Services.
2. The City budget for Fiscal Year 1982-83 is hereby amended:
 - a. by adding thereto the sum of \$1,950 to budget number 2-50-2281-7244-4258 for the purpose stated in paragraph 1 above.
3. The above appropriation increase is supported by additional revenues of \$1,950 that have been received and deposited in the grant fund.
