SUBJECT: Sump 41 Outfall Reconstruction (CC9677) - Fund
Appropriation and Bid Advertisement

SUMMARY

Plans and specifications for this project have been prepared. Additional funding is required and project approval is recommended.

BACKGROUND

The outfall pipes at Sump 41, which is located at the north end of Piedmont Drive at the Sacramento River, have deteriorated and require replacement. It is necessary to replace the pipes on the landward side and the river side of the levee.

FINANCIAL

The City Council has approved \$20,000 in the Public Works budget from Sewer Funds for the project. The total amount currently available is \$19,000. It is proposed that an additional \$30,000 be appropriated from the Sewer Fund for this project.


The project to reconstruct Sump 28 has been overfunded based on the engineer's current estimate on the work to be done. Therefore, it is proposed that \$30,000 from the Sump 28 reconstruction project be returned to the Sewer Fund for the current project for Sump 41.



SUBJECT: Resolution Approving Agreement to Obtain Clay Soil For Final Cover For Landfill

SUMMARY

Approval of an agreement to obtain clay soil for final cover at the Landfill is recommended.

BACKGROUND

At closure of the 28th Street Landfill, final cover, which meets the requirements of the State Water Resources Control Board, must be placed over the Landfill. One requirement is the placement of a layer of clayey material not less than one foot thick to act as a barrier to water infiltration.

The L & P Powell/Teichert Company (LPPT) as part of its South Pocket Lake Development is generating about 140,000 cubic yards of excess clayey soil. LPPT has offered this clayey soil to the City at no cost. The City would be responsible for loading, transporting, and unloading the soil at the Landfill. Soil tests performed by a geotechnical consultant indicate this material is generally suitable for construction of the infiltration barrier.

LPPT has submitted an agreement to the City outlining the general terms and conditions of the proposed offer of the clayey soil.

FINANCIAL

LPPT is offering the clayey material to the City at no cost. However, the City will incur costs of loading, transporting and unloading. City staff estimates that this cost would be on the order of \$3.00/cubic yard. About 60,000 cubic yards would be transported during the 1985-86 Fiscal Year, with the remainder the following year. The Solid Waste Enterprise Fund has sufficient funds budgeted to cover the cost of cover soil procurement this fiscal year.


Next fiscal year, funding will be required to transport the remaining 80,000 cubic yards of soil. This is estimated to cost \$240,000. Approval of this agreement will constitute a commitment in next year's budget.

Council will be requested to authorize staff to receive bids for soil transportation and, subsequently, award contracts.

RECOMMENDATION


It is recommended that the City Council, by passage of the attached Resolution, authorize and direct the City Manager and City Clerk to execute an agreement between the City and LPPT, for the City to receive up to 140,000 cubic yards of clayey soil at no cost to the City.


