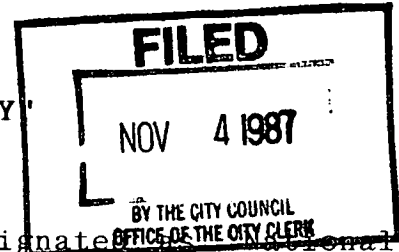


Resolution

"NATIONAL CHEMISTRY DAY"
NOVEMBER 6, 1987



WHEREAS, November 6, 1987, has been designated "National Chemistry Day" and in recognition thereof, the Sacramento Section of the American Chemical Society is celebrating that day with lectures and workshops designated for chemists, educators and the general public; and

WHEREAS, the contributions of chemists in the Sacramento area to agriculture, to health and medical sciences, to energy sources, to material science in its applications to aircraft and space exploration, and to numerous manufacturing industries are vast and pivotal to the economy of this area; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Council of the City of Sacramento, that we join the American Chemical Society in urging the public to observe November 6, 1987 as "National Chemistry Day" in recognition of the commitment and contribution of the chemists and chemical engineers of this community to the well being of its citizens and to the service of all humanity.
