REQUEST FOR APPROVAL TO NEGOTIATE AGREEMENT AND PURCHASE EQUIPMENT AND SOFTWARE FOR AUTOMATED SOLID WASTE COLLECTION ROUTING SYSTEM

# SUMMARY

This report describes the need for an automated solid waste collection routing system and recommends approval for the City Manager to negotiate an agreement for such a system and approval for the Solid Waste Division to purchase equipment and software for the system. It is recommended that funds for the additional cost come from the Solid Waste Contingency Reserve.

#### BACKGROUND

The attached report was heard by the Budget and Finance Committee on October 25, 1988. The Committee approved the staff recommendation.

# **FINANCIAL**

The total project cost is \$87,966. The Solid Waste Division budgeted \$34,965 for computer projects in FY 1988-89. An additional amount of \$53,001 is needed for the routing system; the recommended action would involve transferring \$53,001 from the Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve (415-710-7012-4999) to the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget (415-310-3142-4258). The balance of the Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve on October 14, 1988, was \$4,074,000.00.

## RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council adopt the attached resolution approving the funding related to the automated routing system by transferring \$53,001 from the Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve to the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget and giving the City Manager the authority to negotiate and execute an agreement with Criterion, Inc., and approve the purchase of system hardware and equipment.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL TO NEGOTIATE AGREEMENT AND PURCHASE EQUIPMENT AND SOFTWARE FOR AUTOMATED SOLID WASTE COLLECTION ROUTING SYSTEM

#### SUMMARY

This report requests approval for the City Manager to negotiate an agreement for an automated solid waste collection routing system and approval for the Solid Waste Division to purchase equipment and software for the system.

#### BACKGROUND

The approved budget for FY 1986-87 included \$100,000 for purchase of an automated solid waste routing system. This system is needed to facilitate routing of solid waste collection. The system will also be used for determining routes for "direct haul" to the County landfill.

In December, 1986, the Solid Waste Division was granted approval by the City's Management Information Executive Committee (MIEC) to proceed with the procurement process for such a system. The Request For Proposal (RFP) was released in May, 1987, and was sent to fourteen companies. Three prospective vendors gave written indication that they planned to respond to the RFP; only one proposal was received, from Criterion, Inc. The proposal was evaluated by staff, and it was determined that the system would meet the needs of the Division. Technical meetings and phone calls were held with the proposed vendor and the City's Data Management and Solid Waste staff to solve the problem of interface with the mainframe computer. Since the money was not spent or encumbered in the fiscal year in which it was budgeted, it reverted to fund balance. It was inadvertently excluded from the current fiscal year budget.

At this time, City staff has determined the most cost effective arrangement is for the City to purchase the needed hardware, and for Criterion to supply the software and installation.

# FINANCIAL DATA

The proposed contract from Criterion is for an amount not to exceed \$74,000. In addition, the City will need to purchase equipment and hardware for approximately \$13,966 for a total project cost of \$87,966. The Solid Waste Division budgeted \$34,965 in Organization 3142 (Refuse Collection), Line 4258 (Other Professional Services) for computer projects in FY 1988-89. An additional amount of \$53,001 is needed to provide adequate funds for the routing system. The recommended action involves transferring \$53,001 from the Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve (415-710-7012-4999) to the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget (415-310-3142-4258). The balance of the Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve on October 14, 1988, was \$4,074,000.00.

## RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Budget and Finance Committee approve in concept the described automated routing system and related funding and recommend the full City Council adopt the attached resolution which will give the City Manager the authority to negotiate an agreement with Criterion, Inc. and approve the transfer of \$53,001 from the Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve to the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget, and approve the purchase of system hardware and equipment.
