SUBJECT: Establishment of Policy and Procedures Regarding

Major Settlements under the Section 23 Leasing Program

APPROVED SACRAMENTO LOUSING AUTHORITY

### SUMMARY

The attached resolution establishes the following policy with respect to final approval of settlement amounts under Section 23 Leasing Program:

- Total settlements for \$5,000, and under, will be approved a) by the Executive Director.
- Total settlements from \$5,000 to \$10,000 will be approved b) by the Chairman of the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission with review by an ad hoc Commission subcommittee.
- Total settlements over \$10,000 must be approved by the Housing Authority after review of the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission.
- Appoint an ad hoc three-member committee which shall serve d) until the conversions are completed.

#### BACKGROUND

The Agency is in the process of terminating the Section 23 Leasing Program and converting to the Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments Program (HAPP). Since the conversion process began last summer, the Agency has been operating under informal policy guidance with respect to settlements paid to owners when the Section 23 Leasing Program agreements are terminated. This informal policy has included the approval of projects by the Chairman of the Commission of up to \$5,000.

Three major settlements have been made prior to the appointment of the Interim Executive Director in early October 1980. These previous settlements ranged from \$40,000 on May 20, 1980 to \$6,500 on September 12, 1980. The average settlement was \$16,633. With the Agency being involved in a reorganization and the emergence of a

number of major settlements above \$10,000, it is important to formalize the procedure and policy under which these settlements are to be made and, in the public interest, to provide opportunity for full public disclosure.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no additional financial impact as a result of the proposed policy.

#### VOTE AND RECOMMENDATION OF COMMISSION

At its regular meeting of February 19, 1981 the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission adopted a motion recommending the establishment of policy and procedure regarding major settlements under the Section 23 Leasing Program. The votes were recorded as follows:

# RESOLUTION NO. 81-019

ESTABLISHMENT OF POLICY AND PROCEDURES REGARDING MAJOR SETTLEMENTS UNDER THE SECTION 23 LEASING PROGRAM

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

Section 1. The Chairman of the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission shall appoint an ad hoc committee of three members to serve as a review body for Section 23 conversions.

Section 2. The Executive Director shall have the authority to approve settlements up to \$5,000.

Section 3. The Chairman of the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission, with review by an ad hoc committee, shall have the authority to approve settlements from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

Section 4. The Housing Authority of the City of Sacramento shall approve all settlements over \$10,000, with review and recommendation by the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission.
