

LEAVES OF ABSENCECity Employees Resolution

The Civil Service Board at this time considered the "Resolution to protect City employees drafted for defense work under the Selective Service Draft Call" prepared by the Sacramento Municipal Employees Association and presented to the City Council. The City Council forwarded this report to the Civil Service Board for their study and report. The purpose of the resolution was to grant those drafted for defense work under the Selective Service Draft Call the same rights for military leave as those under the armed forces. It was the consensus of the Board that since no action had been taken by the Federal Government drafting personnel for defense work, it would be advisable to wait until such action was taken before determining what the City policy would be.

SUSPENSION OF CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS

The Board considered the following communications from H. G. Denton, City Clerk:

"A motion was unanimously adopted by the City Council recommending that the Civil Service Board make a study of the possibility of suspending all further Civil Service examinations for promotions or to create new lists and making of all appointments on a temporary basis for the duration of the war, in order to protect the rights of applicants and promotional eligibles serving in the military service of the Government."

The Civil Service Board discussed this letter at considerable length, considering the fact that only certain examinations draw men from the class that were being inducted into the service and also that in these times, the need for more activity in recruitment rather than less activity. The Board considered the establishment of war service appointments from eligible lists which would expire at the conclusion of the war period. Final action was postponed, pending receipt of a report from the City Attorney on the legality of such action.




