#### SUMMARY

The Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District is declaring various treatment plants, including the Meadowview Treatment Plant, surplus property and is disposing of them. The attached resolution authorizes the City Engineer to accept title to the Meadowview Treatment Plant on behalf of the City.

#### **BACKGROUND**

In 1974, the City entered into a Master Interagency Agreement which formed the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District. The primary purpose of the District was to be generally responsible for the treatment of wastewater from the greater Sacramento Metropolitan area. It was more specifically to plan, design, finance and construct the Regional Treatment Plant with its necessary interceptors and pump stations and the Combined Wastewater Control System to serve the City of Sacramento.

A condition of the Master Interagency Agreement (due to Federal grant requirements) was to transfer ownership of our wastewater treatment facilities to the Regional District. In exchange, the Regional District assumed the outstanding sewer bond indebtedness of the City.

Now that the Regional Plant is operational, many of the abandoned treatment plant sites are being determined surplus. Among those sites is the City's old Meadowview Treatment Plant site.

The District retained a consultant to evaluate the future utilization of the site and to recommend disposition alternatives. It was determined that the best use of the Meadowview Plant was to return it to the City for the following reasons:

1. City had expressed an interest in obtaining the site for possible future development of the proposed Freeport Water Treatment Plant.

- 2. The site is land-locked and does not have adequate access for development.
- 3. City owns all the property that surrounds the site.
- 4. Adjacent property includes the City water tank and storm drainage pumping station which places limitations on development potential of the property.
- 5. Demolition costs for the property approximately equal the appraised value of the property.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Meadowview Treatment Plant site will be transferred as is to the City for no cost. Minor costs will be incurred in periodic inspection of the site.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the attached Resolution that allows the City Engineer to accept the Meadowivew Treatment Plant from the Regional County Sanitation District and retain it for possible use in the Freeport Water Treatment Plant.
