**2.3 City policy regarding outdoor vending on private property**

Margaret Freeman, Revenue Manager for the City of Sacramento, presented the report. Since a quorum wasn't present, decision was made to not provide direction to staff. Margaret told Committee of the two options available to allow outdoor vending on private property.

Committee Member Steinberg expressed concern over the cost for a permit. Where are we in terms of cost if only three or four areas are chosen for "pilot" implementation?

Margaret Freeman said the City needs feedback from neighborhood associations and business associations to see if there is a need or desire for expanded vending throughout the City. The "pilot" program will be in a specific geographic area. Specific areas could include: Franklin Boulevard; Stockton Boulevard (Broadway to Alhambra); Broadway (Highway 99 to Sacramento River); and Del Paso Boulevard.

Committee Member Ortiz questioned the "pilot" program location on Stockton Boulevard. She would like it to go from Stockton Boulevard to the river.

Committee Member Ortiz would like an editing change on Page 2, Option 3. Add the word "flowers" to "restricted to food and beverages" language. Committee Member Ortiz also requested that an amendment be made to the Central Business District definition.

**2.4 An Ordinance amending Title 25 of the Sacramento City Code relating to residential permit parking**

Michael Melvin, Chief, On-Street Parking for the City of Sacramento, presented report. If approved and forwarded to City Council the ordinance amendment would delete the lengthy petitioning process and parking surveys/studies.

Committee Member Steinberg asked what the current process is in terms of "petition process?"

Michael Melvin said the City surveys residents in the area and the City needs 50% in favor to allow residential permit parking.

Committee Member Fargo told Committee that many residents will not sign a petition and there may be a language barrier to deal with. A lot of residents are in favor of residential parking but are against petition process. Committee Member Fargo is against preferred residential parking.

Committee Member Ortiz asked why the City does the survey process for residential parking permits? How does the City balance issue of commercial strips next to residential area?

1.1 Summary of State Legislation

Mike Coleman, Senior Management Analyst, gave a brief overview of the bills before the State Legislation and explained where it currently stood and what position the City was taking. Mike will give the Committee a weekly update on the legislation pending. Mike expressed his concerns with two bills, AB 318 and AB 486. AB 318 (Katz) and AB 486 (Goldsmith) each would mean a multi-million dollar impact to the general fund.

2.0 STAFF REPORTS

2.1 Reorganization of Solid Waste Advisory Committee/AB 939 Task Force (SWAC/LTF) and Elimination of the City of Sacramento Recycling Advisory Subcommittee.

Gary Van Dorst, Solid Waste Planning Manager, gave an overview of the proposed ordinance. The ordinance recommends reorganization of the SWAC/LTF. Swac's reorganization will streamline the process of citizen review related to solid waste issues. City and County staff are coordinating efforts to streamline the review process for solid waste management issues that affect the County and the cities of Sacramento, Folsom, Isleton, and Galt. The current membership of SWAC is comprised of nine members, four appointed by the City, four appointed by the County, and one appointed by the cities of Folsom, Isleton and Galt.
