SUBJECT: Claim of Contractor Pertaining to the Lot G

Parking Structure

#### SUMMARY

The attached resolution rejects the claim of Continental Heller-Campbell, a joint venture, relating to the construction of the Lot G Parking Structure at 3rd and L Streets.

#### BACKGROUND

During the course of construction of the Lot G Parking Structure, the Contractor, Continental Heller-Campbell, made a series of claims for additional moneys which were rejected by the City Engineer acting on behalf of the Agency in supervising construction. The Contractor has now summarized these amounts in the attached claim.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The total mount of the attached claim appears to be \$56,943.00. There would be no financial impact upon its rejection.

#### VOTE AND RECOMMENDATION OF COMMISSION

It is anticipated that at its meeting of March 16, 1981, the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission will adopt a motion recommending that you take the above-mentioned action. In the event they fail to do so, you will be advised prior to your March 17, 1981 meeting.

CLAIM

In accordance with the provisions of Section 910, et seq., of the Government Code of the State of California, Continental Heller-Campbell, a joint venture (hereinafter "Claimant"), makes claim against the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento and the City of Sacramento (hereinafter collectively "the agency") and submits the following information in support thereof:

- A. Claimant's principal offices are located at 555 Capitol Mall, Sacramento, California 95814, and its mailing address is P. O. Box 2551, Sacramento, California 95812.
- B. Claimant requests that all notices regarding this claim be sent to McDonough, Holland & Allen, A Professional

Corporation, Attention Harry E. Hull, Jr., 555 Capitol Mall, Suite 950, Sacramento, California 95814.

C. The circumstances of this claim arise out of the construction project known as Lot "G" Parking Structure, 3rd and L Streets, Sacramento, California. Claimant, a general contractor, bid this job and entered into a written contract for the construction of the project and further entered into certain subcontracts for portions of the work, including subcontracts with Basalt Rock Company, Inc., for precast panels; Caulking and Water Proofing Corporation for caulking work; and Robert A. Walker, Inc., for certain of the mechanical subcontract work.

During the course of the construction of the Lot "G"

Parking Structure, claimant and the above named subcontractors

encountered conditions which required additional work and expense

over and above that covered by the various contracts. These

additional expenses were each the subject of change orders sub
mitted to and eventually denied by the Redevelopment Agency of

the City of Sacramento.

The individual claims are as follows:

#### 1. Precast Architectural Spandrel Panels.

#### a. Facts.

Basalt Rock Company, Inc., contracted to provide and erect the precast architectural spandrel panels which were to be installed on the outside of the building at each floor level. The size and configuration of the top bearing clips which anchor the panel to the parking structure was set forth and specified in the contract drawings prepared by the City's

Structural Engineer. Basalt made its bid in reliance upon the size of the clips required in the drawings.

After work commenced Basalt determined that the top bearing clips as set forth in the City's contract drawings were not structurally adequate to carry the weight of the panels. Basalt therefore was required to redesign and fabricate new and adequate bearing clips.

The precast panels were not altered or changed by claimant or Basalt in any manner and are of the design, size and composition required by the contract drawings. As such there was no significant weight change between the panels called for in the drawings and the panels actually placed on the building.

The additional expense of the new bearing clips was caused solely by the City's erroneous calculations as to the adequacy of the bearing clips specifically called for in the contract drawings.

#### b. Additional Costs.

Additional costs totaled \$8,937 as set forth and detailed in Exhibit A attached hereto.

#### c. Public Employees Responsible.

To the extent presently known the names of the public employees responsible are as follows:

John Schaeffer, Structural Engineer;
Bob Michitish, Architect.

#### Caulking at Precast Panels.

#### a. Facts.

Caulking and Water Proofing Corporation contracted to provide sealants and caulking on the project. After the commencement of work, Caulking discovered that it was required to caulk an additional 2,500 lineal feet of one inch precast column joints. While there was a very general reference to the caulking of precast panel joints in the specifications, there was no indication of the location, width or number of these joints on the contract plans or drawings from which Caulking and Water Proofing necessarily had to bid their job.

Further, they were later requested to and did caulk all roof columns at the N-W stair, an item not on their original contract.

#### b. Additional Costs.

Additional costs total \$12,132, as set forth and detailed in Exhibit B attached hereto.

#### c. Public Employees Responsible.

Bob Michitish, Architect.

To the extent presently known, the names of the public employees responsible are as follows:

#### 3rd Street Shoring.

#### a. Facts.

Robert A. Walker, Inc., Mechanical Contractors, subcontracted to, among other things, install a ten inch storm drain and sewer across 3rd Street from the project. During the course of their excavation, they encountered conditions which they did not anticipate and which they should not reasonably have been expected to anticipate.

Specifically, after digging about eight feet Walker Mechanical encountered an old buried fire hydrant which apparently had been leaking for many years. Due primarily to the leaking fire hydrant and poorly compacted soil, there occurred a series of cave-ins which delayed the work.

In addition, an old storm drain and sewer were found and had to be removed. This caused additional cave-ins which, in turn, made the wood shoring inadequate. Walker Mechanical was then required to order and use metal shoring to protect its workers, thus incurring further delays and costs.

Walker Mechanical had been told by the utility companies prior to excavation there were no pipes in the street with the exception of one belonging to SMUD which Walker found.

Walker Mechanical could not reasonably have anticipated unmarked, forgotten fire lines, hydrants or utility lines which it had been told were not there.

#### b. Additional Costs.

Additional costs total \$5,987, as set forth and detailed in Exhibit C attached hereto.

#### c. Public Employees Responsible.

To the extent presently known, the names of the public employees responsible are as follows:

- R. H. Parker, City Engineer;
- T. A. Schmidt, Construction Supervisor;

Don F. Henderson, Construction Inspector of the Department of Engineering, City of Sacramento; and

Bob Michitish, Architect.

#### 4. Raising of Manholes.

#### a. Facts.

Robert A. Walker, Inc., Mechanical Contractors, subcontracted in part to raise certain manholes in the project area. The original drawings and specifications for the Lot "G" parking structure made no mention of two manholes Walker Mechanical was later required to raise, specifically one on the east side of the tunnel wall at column line C-3 and one northeast of column line A and the tunnel wall.

Addendum 1 dated December 6, 1977, did require the raising of certain additional manholes as set forth on sheet M-1. However, the clouded portion of sheet M-1 which indicated the changes in the drawings and specifications being made did not include the two manholes for which claim is now made, reasonably

leading Walker Mechanical to believe they were to be the responsibility of the City. While it perhaps was not the City's responsibility to highlight changes in the drawings and specifications, if the City chose to do so, it was its responsibility to insure that such highlighting was not misleading.

#### b. Additional Costs.

Additional costs total \$1,631, as set forth and detailed in Exhibit D attached hereto.

#### c. Public Employees Responsible.

To the extent presently known, the names of the public employees responsible are as follows:

Bob Michitish, Architect;

D. F. Dickerson & Associates, Mechanical Engineers.

#### 5. Testing.

#### a. Facts.

During the course of construction of the project, portions of the work were required to be specially tested and approved.

During a substantial portion of the construction, testing was being accomplished by

J. H. Kleinfelder & Associates. Tests conducted on four separate areas of the work in particular caused claimant delay and additional expense. Specifically, soil compaction tests of the structural fill in the tunnel area were done time and again until finally

Kleinfelder decided the compaction and moisture content met specifications. Secondly, post-tension cable tests conducted by Kleinfelder initially showed noncompliance with specifications, but within a week of Kleinfelder's tests, tests conducted by the State of California Testing Laboratory showed the cables to be properly stressed. Third, concrete cylinder tests conducted by Kleinfelder after 7 days of curing, provided low strength results which delayed certain other work which could have been done at this stage of curing. The tests conducted after 28 days of curing indicated that the concrete strength met specifications. Fourth, in July 1978, threaded rebar was tested and found to be below specifications. Kleinfelder retested the rebar the following day and found it to be within specifications. Each of these inaccurate test results caused delays and additional expenses as cumulatively set forth below.

#### Additional Costs.

Additional costs total \$20,716, as set forth and detailed in Exhibit E attached hereto.

#### c. Public Employees Responsible.

To the extent presently known, the names of the public employees responsible are as follows:

- J. H. Kleinfelder & Associates
   Testing Laboratories;
- R. H. Parker, City Engineer.

#### 6. Beneficial Occupancy.

#### a. Facts.

During the course of construction, claimant encountered unavoidable delays which set the construction schedule back approximately 60 days. Much of this delay was attributable to a water main break which was not the fault of Continental Heller. That incident is the subject of a separate claim and lawsuit. The break caused flooding of the excavation and approximately 23 days passed before the ground was dry enough to proceed with the construction. The remaining time delays were due to heavy and frequent rains which, because of the state of construction at the time of the rains, stopped the work and further delayed construction.

Originally, the City was to have beneficial occupancy of the first two parking levels on November 15, 1978. Due to the above mentioned delays, claimant justly would have until January 15, 1979, to provide beneficial occupancy. In an effort to cooperate with the City and to provide much needed parking space for the holiday season, claimant and its subcontractors did a considerable amount of extra work and encountered extra expense as detailed below. Due to Continental Heller's extra effort, beneficial occupancy was provided on November 18, 1978, approximately 60 days ahead of schedule.

#### b. Additional Costs.

Additional costs total \$15,998, as set forth and detailed in Exhibit F attached hereto.

#### c. Public Employees Responsible.

To the extent presently known, the public employees responsible for these expenses are:

R. H. Parker, City Engineer;

William Gentry, City Engineer.

#### 7. Additional Grade Adjustments.

#### a. Facts.

The City of Sacramento has withheld \$7,540 from claimant for additional costs charged to the City by Allen L. Bender, Inc., for grade adjustments Bender has claimed it made during its work on the K Street Mall extension.

All parties concede that the area was initially graded within contract specifications by claimant and its subcontractor, East Bay Dirt. However, after the initial grading was complete dirt was removed and the grade changed due to an erroneous original design grade calculation made by the City in the area of the tramway. This area was regraded with the concurrence of Bill Gentry, City Engineer, in order to reroute the tramway and to allow the fire department access to the Holiday Inn.

Any grade adjustments made were not the fault of or caused by Continental Heller and thus the cost has been wrongfully charged to them.


