SUBJECT: Sacramento County Solid Waste Management Plan Revision

SUMMARY

This report informs the City Council that Sacramento County has revised its Solid Waste Management Plan. City staff has participated in the plans revision and has reviewed the documented revision. Thus it is recommended that the City Council approve the attached resolution accepting the plan.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The 1972 Nejedby-Z'berg-Dills Solid Waste Management and Resource Recovery Act required that each county in California prepare a solid waste management plan. Government Code Sections 66780 and 66780.5 mandated that County Board of Supervisors be the primary agency responsible for preparing, adopting, maintaining and implementing coordinated solid waste management plans. As a minimum, the plan as developed must assess current and future solid waste management problems faced by jurisdictions within the county. Solutions to specific problems should be developed and courses of action shall be selected to rectify the problem(s).

Sacramento County, with the aid and approval of the City of Sacramento, developed and implemented the requisite plan in 1976.

California State law also required that the plan be reviewed at periodic intervals and when necessary the plan was to be revised. Sacramento has reviewed its plan determined that it was necessary to revise the plan.

The revised plan must be approved by a majority of the cities within the county which contain a majority of the population of the incorporated area of the county. The proposed plan revision shall be submitted to each city within the county. Approval actions by the cities for the plan revision shall be in the form of resolutions from the governing body of the cities within the county. The resolution shall state the cities concurrence in:

- (3) procedures for financing the recommended program and
- (4) the role identified in the plan for the particular city

RESOLUTION NO. 83-680

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION CONCURRING IN THE 1983
REVISION TO THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY
SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Nejedly-Z'berg-Dills Solid Waste Management and Resource Recovery Act of 1972 (hereafter referred as the Act) required each county in cooperation with affected local jurisdictions, to prepare a comprehensive, coordinated solid waste management plan; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sacramento and the four cities therein did prepare and adopt a solid waste management plan in 1977; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the County Solid Waste Management Plan be reviewed periodically to determine if a revision to that plan is required; and

WHEREAS, said Act also requires that any revision to the County Solid Waste Management Plan shall be subject to the approval by a majority of the cities within the county which contain a majority of the population of the incorporated area of the county; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sacramento has prepared a Revision to the Solid Waste Management Plan in conformance with the Act and on May 18, 1983 submitted said revision to this council for approval;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Sacramento approves said Revision and concurs in the following: (a) the objectives set forth in the revision, (b) the method and organization for implementation of the programs contained in the revision, (c) the procedures for financing the recommended solid waste management programs, and (d) the role identified in the revision for the City in implementing this cooperative effort for management of solid waste in an economical and environmentally acceptable manner.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing approval and concurrence is subject to the following changes being made in said Revision:

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CITY CLERK

1. On page 6, change "The L & D Landfill has adopted an expansion plan" to "The L & D Landfill has adopted and implemented an expansion plan".

2. On page 17, change "The Sacramento City Council has appropriated \$773,000 which, with the State Solid Waste Management Board (SSWMB) grant of \$227,000 to the City, will be used to...and cool 16 state office buildings." to "The Sacramento City Council has appropriated \$1,500,000 which, with the State Waste Management Board (SWMB) grant of \$227,000 to the City, will be used to....cool 21 state office buildings."

3. On page 18, change "Acquire two parcels (41 acres and 27 acres) of land adjacent to existing City landfill and establish another landfill site." to "Acquire two parcels (7 acres and 27 acres) of land adjacent and contiguous to the existing landfill and establish another landfill site."

4. On page 21, change "The County Public Works Department permits private collectors in the unincorporated area, while the City Planning Department permits private haulers in the City of Sacramento." to "The County Public Works Department permits private collectors in the unincorporated area, while the City Community Development Department permits private haulers in the City of Sacramento. The Community Development Department in conjunction with the County Health Department also functions as the local enforcement agency in the City of Sacramento."

5. After Page 81 of Appendix B insert a copy of Sacramento City Ordinance Number 82-097, Chapter 71 of the City Code "Hazardous Materials Disclosure".
