

MINUTES OF CIVIL SERVICE BOARD
CITY OF SACRAMENTO

REGULAR MEETING

January 19, 1933

The Civil Service Board met in regular session at 8:05 o'clock P.M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Weisman presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Chenu, Deise, and President Weisman.
ABSENT : None.

The minutes of the special meetings of January 13, 1933, and January 17, 1933, were read and there being no objections were ordered approved.

In order to conform to the provisions of Section 2 of Rule X, Civil Service Board Rules and Regulations, Commissioner Chenu moved that the minutes of past special meetings be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Deise and unanimously carried.

J. H. HOLLAND
DATE OF EMPLOYMENT

December 16, 1932, J. H. Holland appeared before the Board, requesting that the Board review his dates of appointment into the Fire Department. The matter was referred to the City Attorney and his memorandum reply, dated December 28, 1932, was read to the Board. After discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Deise that J. H. Holland's date of employment be considered as October 6, 1914, and that the period when Mr. Holland was not employed by the city, between July 9, 1918, and December 15, 1920, be omitted in computing Mr. Holland's period of service with the city. Seconded by Commissioner Chenu and unanimously carried.

PETER J. LEE
REINSTATEMENT

In considering the request of Mr. Lee for reinstatement as made January 17, 1933, and after reviewing his service record, date of appointment, lay-offs and discharge, and further because Rule VIII, Section 1, of the Civil Service Board Rules and Regulations prohibits the reinstatement of a person who has been out of the employ of the city for more than one year, Commissioner Chenu moved that Mr. Lee's application be denied. Seconded by Commissioner Deise and unanimously carried.

EMERGENCY APPOINTMENT
LISTS

In further discussing the establishment of emergency appointment lists which might be used by such departments as Garbage and Pumping in cases of emergency, a letter was read from the City Attorney, dated January 17, 1933, in which he stated it was competent for the Board to establish such lists from existing eligible lists and that the highest upon the list should be called first. The Secretary was instructed to prepare a Resolution for the Board to consider, in order that such necessary lists might be established.

BACK SALARIES AFTER
DISMISSAL

At the request of President Weisman, the City Attorney submitted a letter discussing the recent case of Bedford vs. Moulton, No. 47839, Sacramento County Superior Court, stating that in this case Mr. Bedford had been discharged contrary to the provisions of the State Civil Service Commission, and, therefore, was entitled to back pay from his date of dismissal. The City Attorney's letter was ordered filed for future reference.

ELIGIBLE LISTS
DISCUSSION

The Board, realizing that many of the existing eligible registers were several years old

and insufficient, reviewed the registers and after discussion the Secretary was requested to prepare an analysis of those which were in existence prior to 1930, and a plan of procedure for further study of the Board.

DEPARTMENTAL TRANSFERS

During general discussion of the meeting, the question arose as to the status of an employee

who has been transferred in a manner similar to those transferred from the Incinerator, with Stationary Fireman's classifications, to the Garbage Department as Laborers. The Secretary was instructed to request the City Attorney for an expression of opinion in this matter.

Due to the close acquaintance of each of the Board members to Carlos K. McClatchy, deceased, Commissioner Chenu moved that the following Resolution of adjournment be approved at 10:15 P.M., the date and hour of the next meeting being subject to the call of the President. Seconded by Commissioner Deise and unanimously carried.

RESOLVED, that because of the friendly acquaintance of each of the members of the Civil Service Board with Carlos K. McClatchy and immediate members of his family,

THAT the Civil Service Board hereby adjourns its regular meeting of January 19, 1933, in memory of Carlos K. McClatchy, who has been a sincere friend of municipal endeavor,
