SUBJECT: Fire Station No. 12 Apparatus Doors Replacement

SUMMARY

This report evaluates the condition of existing apparatus doors necessary to establish an emergency condition requiring immediate attention. The report requests waiver of formal competitive bidding and award of a construction contract.

BACKGROUND

Due to the extensive amount of annual repair work on the apparatus doors and the emergency nature of this facility, it has become necessary to replace the doors as soon as possible to avoid impediment of response times to emergency personnel and install emergency signals to avoid the accidental impact of fire trucks to the new doors.

Facility Management surveyed selected local area general contractors and received competitive prices and are as follows:




RECOMMENDATION
