**SUBJECT: IMPLEMENTATION OF A LAWN AND GARDEN SERVICE FEE AND REPEAL OF THE LAWN AND GARDEN REFUSE EXCISE TAX**

**SUMMARY**

The attached report recommends implementing a new Lawn and Garden Service Fee and repealing the Lawn and Garden Refuse Tax, effective April 1, 1991. The Budget and Finance/Transportation and Community Development Committees considered this report at the January 22, 1991 meeting and voted to recommend City Council approval as presented. Revisions were made to reflect staff's presentation, varying from the original submittal.

**BACKGROUND**

Background information is presented in the attached report to the Budget and Finance/Transportation and Community Development Committees. The report was modified to document that households residing in areas without concrete curbs and gutters will be given an option of retaining the service or being released. Additionally, the rates (Exhibit A) were modified to accommodate the option available to those households without concrete curbs and gutters by charging only those households with concrete curbs and gutters for street sweeping.

**FINANCIAL DATA**

Financial information is presented in the attached report to the Budget and Finance/Transportation and Community Development Committees. The report was corrected to indicate a \$.25 (instead of \$.75) per month charge for most customers necessary to restore the revenue to its current level on a continuing basis. (See Page 3, "Financial Data", paragraph four.)

**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

Policy considerations are discussed in the attached report to the Budget and Finance/Transportation and Community Development Committees. This report deletes a previous reference to policy issue number two. The ordinance (Exhibit B) was modified to provide households residing in areas without concrete curbs and gutters an option of retaining the service or being released.

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**RECOMMENDATION**


Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the following:

SUBJECT:     **IMPLEMENTATION OF A LAWN AND GARDEN SERVICE FEE AND REPEAL OF THE  
LAWN AND GARDEN REFUSE EXCISE TAX**

**SUMMARY**

Staff recommends that a lawn and garden service fee be established which reflects those costs which are currently billed to customers for services associated with garden refuse collection, garden refuse disposal, and street sweeping in residential areas with concrete curbs and gutters and that the existing lawn and garden refuse excise tax be repealed effective on April 1, 1991. This Lawn and Garden Service Fee will be implemented on April 1, 1991.

These actions do not raise rates initially and will not result in any customer receiving a higher monthly utility bill at this time.

**BACKGROUND**

In May of 1976, the City established a Lawn and Garden Refuse Excise Tax. This excise tax, as enacted, is for the privilege of residential households depositing garden refuse on City streets rather than for the actual use of the service as provided. As a uniformly imposed excise tax, there are inequities in payments for the service. City staff now proposes to repeal the excise tax and establish a more equitable service fee



as the method for financing the collection and disposal of garden refuse and for street sweeping. This action will not raise any customer's bill at this time.

The 1990/91 monthly utility bill for most residential customers (90% of the households) identifies \$10.48 for "Garbage Service" and \$2.00 for "Lawn and Garden Service". Current services billed under "Garbage Service" include garbage collection, garbage disposal, nuisance abatement, neighborhood cleanups, household toxics collection, recycling (as of October 1, 1990), \$.50 for street sweeping, and a \$1.64 subsidy to the garden refuse program. Staff's proposal to split the street sweeping component and the garden refuse collection and disposal subsidy off from the garbage service bill will provide residential customers with a clearer description of what portion of the utility bill pays for each service. The following example applies to a residential household with concrete curbs and gutters utilizing an auto-lift container for garbage, located in other than a planned community:

For most households, the total amount of the current utility bill will remain unchanged if the fee structure is redefined by implementing a lawn and garden service fee and repealing the lawn and garden refuse excise tax. Approximately 7050 households throughout the city will see a monthly utility bill reduction ranging from \$1.64 to \$4.14. Exhibit A identifies the rate changes that would be made in the Fee and Charge Manual. These households represent 8% of the residential garbage customers and include (1) parcels without concrete curbs and gutters, (2) parcels on private streets, and (3) parcels on public streets located in planned communities (including mobile homes). Parcels without concrete curbs and gutters (approximately 2850 households) will be given an option to continue or discontinue the separate lawn and garden refuse collection/disposal service provided by the City.

Implementation of the lawn and garden service fee will be delayed until April 1, 1991 to provide for program modifications to the Utility Customer Information System (UCIS) required to convert from an excise tax to a fee for service. The lawn and garden refuse excise tax will be repealed April 1, 1991, if the conversion to the fee structure is approved.

The proposed conversion to a fee would accomplish two purposes: (1) it would redistribute the charges which appear on the monthly utility bill by removing the street sweeping and garden refuse subsidy components from the garbage service bill (\$.50 and \$1.64 respectively) and incorporating them into a lawn

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and garden service bill for specific customer classes--single and double family residences comprising about 90% of all households; and, (2) for certain other customer classes--planned communities, mobile homes, and parcels which lack concrete curbs and gutters--it would realign the charges paid by the customer with the level of service received.

In addition, as composting and recycling issues are addressed in the near future, it may be necessary to mandate refuse separation at the source. Those households that are disposing of lawn and garden refuse by placing it in their garbage container may, at a later date, be required to place their lawn and garden refuse in a separate container, which may result in adding a fee for lawn and garden refuse collection and disposal to those households who are not required to pay this fee under this action.

FINANCIAL DATA

The approved budget contains \$6,402,771 for lawn and garden services (garden refuse pickup, disposal and street sweeping). The minor modifications in service which are proposed as a part of the conversion to a fee for service are not expected to result in any changes to the budgeted expenditures.

The current revenue budget for FY 90-91 shows revenue of \$2,570,000 from the Lawn and Garden Excise Tax and \$19,474,000 in garbage collection and disposal fees (utility service charges). Repeal of the tax and conversion to a fee for service would lead to complete exemptions from lawn and garden service fees for 4,050 households and partial exemptions equal to the fee for lawn and garden refuse collection and disposal for 3,000 households. The net effect of these actions would reduce total revenues by \$73,766 for FY 90-91. The specific effects are shown below:

Current policy is to maintain contingency reserves at a minimum level equal to 4% of revenues. The Solid Waste Fund Contingency Reserve currently has a balance of \$675,000, \$264,000 below the \$939,000 needed to maintain the 4% of revenues level. This action will further reduce the contingency reserve by \$73,766.

Replenishing the Contingency Reserve for the \$73,766 which will be lost this year would require a one time infusion of funds equivalent to 0.35% revenue increase in the Solid Waste Fund. Restoring the revenue to

and garden service bill for specific customer classes--single and double family residences comprising about 90% of all households; and, (2) for certain other customer classes--planned communities, mobile homes, and parcels which lack concrete curbs and gutters--it would realign the charges paid by the customer with the level of service received.

In addition, as composting and recycling issues are addressed in the near future, it may be necessary to mandate refuse separation at the source. Those households that are disposing of lawn and garden refuse by placing it in their garbage container may, at a later date, be required to place their lawn and garden refuse in a separate container, which may result in adding a fee for lawn and garden refuse collection and disposal to those households who are not required to pay this fee under this action.

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Replenishing the Contingency Reserve for the \$73,766 which will be lost this year would require a one time infusion of funds equivalent to 0.35% revenue increase in the Solid Waste Fund. Restoring the revenue to



its current level on a continuing basis will take a 1.4% rate increase in Solid Waste utility service charges, approximately \$.25 per month for most customers. Staff will present a specific proposal for adjusting fees both within and between the Garbage Collection and Disposal Program and the Lawn and Garden Service Program pending the outcome of additional analyses.

As indicated in previous staff reports to Council, the Lawn and Garden Service Program is currently supported from Garden Refuse Excise Tax revenues, a partial subsidy from residential garbage rates, and an additional subsidy from the Solid Waste Fund. With the adoption of the Lawn and Garden Service Fee, the residential can garbage rate subsidy will be absorbed by the new fee. However, program costs will continue to exceed revenues from this fee with the balance made up by the Solid Waste Fund. Total program costs are about \$6.1 million. The remaining subsidy to the program from other rate classes amounts to approximately \$1.2 million. As part of the 1991-92 budget process, staff intends to propose adjustments to the Lawn and Garden Service Fee that will make equity adjustments to align all Solid Waste Utility Service Fees more closely with actual service costs.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

The City's current policy utilizes an "excise tax" to collect a portion of the total cost of providing garden refuse collection, garden refuse disposal, and street sweeping in residential areas. Residents are required to pay for the lawn and garden service even if they reside in an area where the services are not available. The proposed ordinance will change this policy such that:

- (1) No customer will be charged more initially than they are currently paying, although some customers who are not eligible for the services will be relieved of paying for them;
- (2) Only those residents who are eligible for the services will pay for the services provided by the City. The Lawn and Garden Service Fee will be mandatory. This is consistent with current policy which requires residents to pay for garbage service.

Attached to this report (Exhibit B) is a copy of the current ordinance which identifies the recommended changes. The proposed conversion to a fee is intended to redistribute the charges which appear on the monthly utility bill and realign the charges paid by the residential customer with the level of service offered.





CHAPTER 19

Article IV - Garden Refuse

§ 19.400 Reserved

§ 19.401 Garden Refuse--Defined.

As used in this article the term "garden refuse" means leaves, grass cuttings, and garden trimmings, weeds and roots from which all dirt has been removed, shrubbery, and tree trimmings of which no single piece shall exceed ~~thirty-six~~ (36) inches in length, 4 inches in diameter, or ~~forty~~ (40) pounds in weight. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 3786, §10; Ord. 3795, §1; Ord. 3813, §1; Ord. 3875, §11; MEASURE A ADOPTED 09-27-77 STATES THIS SECTION CANNOT BE AMENDED OR REPEALED WITHOUT A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO)

§ 19.402 Lawn and Garden Service--Defined.

As used in this article the term "lawn and garden service" means the periodic collection by the Department of Public Works of garden refuse from City streets, the disposal of said garden refuse, and the periodic sweeping of those streets.

§ 19.403 Repealed by Ordinance No. 4363. Property Classification--Defined.

As used in this article, property is classified as follows:

(a) Residential:

Single-family residences: each property where there is only one dwelling unit on one parcel of property which is used primarily for single-family purposes.

Two-family residences: each property used primarily for two-family residential purposes.

Multi-family residences: each property used primarily for residential purposes having more than two but less than 51 dwelling units.

Multiple family residences containing more than 50 dwelling units shall be considered as being property used primarily for non-residential purposes.

(b) Non-residential: each property used primarily for non-residential purposes. For purposes of this article, any residential condominium, residential planned development, residential stock cooperative, or mobile home park shall be classified as non-residential property.

The City Council finds and determines:

- (a) That the public health, safety, and welfare of all the citizens of the City requires that the accumulation and disposal of garden refuse from properties within the City be handled in a manner producing the greatest good and least public inconvenience, cost, and maintenance to the City and its citizens.
- (b) That ~~the privilege of~~ depositing garden refuse in the streets in front of properties within the City for periodic collection, ~~and disposal, and street sweeping~~ by the Department of Public Works is a ~~privilege~~ service afforded by the City which is of substantial benefit to owners of all properties within the City to which the ~~privilege~~ service is extended.   - (1) ~~The owners of those residential properties with concrete curbs and gutters.~~
  - (2) ~~The owners of those residential properties without concrete curbs and gutters, who have requested the service, been approved by the Director of Public Works, and have agreed to pay the required fee.~~
  - (3) ~~The owners of those non-residential properties with concrete curbs and gutters, who have requested the service and have agreed to pay the required fee based on the amount deposited in the street.~~
- (e) ~~That depositing garden refuse in the streets of the City in front of properties not provided the periodic garden refuse collection and disposal services by City forces is prohibited.~~
- (f) ~~That street sweeping services are to be continued for, and charged to, all properties, (residential and non-residential) having concrete curbs and gutters, and that depositing garden refuse in the streets of the City in front of commercial, industrial and agricultural properties should be restricted to those properties the owners of which are willing to subscribe to and pay the City an excise tax for the privilege extended to their properties which is based upon actual amounts of garden refuse deposited in City streets. #### ~~§ 19.405~~ ~~§ 19.406~~ **Deposit of Garden Refuse Authorized—Residential Property.**

Garden refuse produced on residential properties with concrete curbs and gutters used primarily for residential purposes may be deposited in the streets of the City at the times and in the manner prescribed by this article. Garden refuse from eligible residential property shall be placed in the street in front of and contiguous to the properties from which the garden refuse is removed. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 3786, §13; Ord. 3795, §1; Ord. 3813, §1; Ord. 3875, §13; Ord. 90-031, §1)

Owners of residential properties without concrete curbs and gutters who wish to have periodic collection and disposal of garden refuse from the streets in front of their properties may petition the Director of Public Works to have their property serviced. The Director of Public Works will grant or deny the petition based on feasibility, cost and efficiency requirements of the City. Any petition granted under this section will bind the property owner to continue the service for the remainder of time the property owner owns the property.

The Director of Public Works will notify the property owner of the granting of the petition and of the irrevocability of the provision of service. Those owners of residential properties without concrete curbs and gutters whose petitions are approved by the Director of Public Works under this section shall receive the service at the times and in the manner prescribed by this article for owners of residential properties with concrete curbs and gutters, or in such other manner as mandated by the Director of Public Works.

Garden refuse produced on residential properties not provided garden refuse collection and disposal services by City forces shall not be deposited in the streets of the City.

It shall be unlawful and an infraction punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 for any person to deposit garden refuse in the streets of the City in a manner other than that expressly authorized by this article. No garden refuse shall at any time be placed for collection in a manner which shall: (a) impede traffic or constitute a hazard to traffic; (b) impede the flow of water through any drainage channel or in any manner impede the drainage of water; or (c) be on or impede any public sidewalk or other public walkway. All garden refuse placed in the streets will be placed and maintained in as compact a pile as possible. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 3813, §1; Ord. 3875, §12; Ord. 90-031, §1)

#### ~~§ 19.406~~ **Place of Deposit.**

Garden refuse shall be placed in the street in front of and contiguous to the residential properties from which the garden refuse is removed. Where there is no curb and gutter on the streets contiguous to the residential properties from which the garden refuse is removed, it shall be placed in containers or tied in bundles of which no single piece shall exceed thirty six (36) inches in length, four (4) inches in diameter, or exceed forty (40) pounds in weight. This material shall also be deposited contiguous to the traveled portions of the streets' right of ways.

In no event shall classification in either of these classes qualify any property for any other classification or ~~rate fee~~.

- (e) **Rates. Fees.** Any property classified on the bare lot classification shall pay the ~~excise tax lawn and garden service fee~~ imposed by this article ~~at the rate~~ of \$0.00 per month. Any property classified in the multiple use lot classification shall pay the ~~excise tax lawn and garden service fee~~ imposed by this article ~~at one rate~~ equal to the single highest ~~rate fee~~ which would be imposed on any one structure located on the property according to the other classifications in this article. **Section 1.**

Based on this data and all information part of the public record of this matter, the City Council makes the following findings:

- (1) The Lawn and Garden Service Fee will provide funds to meet residential area operating expenses for garden refuse collection, garden refuse disposal, and street sweeping.
- (2) The Lawn and Garden Service Fee will permit the purchase of necessary equipment for residential area garden refuse collection, garden refuse disposal, and street sweeping.

**Section 2.**

**§ 19.402 Lawn and Garden Service—Defined.**

As used in this article the term "lawn and garden service" means the periodic collection by the Department of Public Works of garden refuse from City streets, the disposal of said garden refuse, and the periodic sweeping of those streets.

**§ 19.403 Property Classification—Defined.**

As used in this article, property is classified as follows:

(a) Residential:

Single-family residences: each property where there is only one dwelling unit on one parcel of property which is used primarily for single-family purposes.

Two-family residences: each property used primarily for two-family residential purposes.

Multi-family residences: each property used primarily for residential purposes having more than two but less than 51 dwelling units.

Multiple family residences containing more than 50 dwelling units shall be considered as being property used primarily for non-residential purposes.

(b) Non-residential: each property used primarily for non-residential purposes. For purposes of this article, any residential condominium, residential planned development, residential stock cooperative, or mobile home park shall be classified as non-residential property.

The City Council finds and determines:

- (a) That the public health, safety, and welfare of all the citizens of the City requires that the accumulation and disposal of garden refuse from properties within the City be handled in a manner producing the greatest good and least public inconvenience, cost, and maintenance to the City and its citizens.
- (b) That depositing garden refuse in the streets in front of properties within the City for periodic collection, disposal, and street sweeping by the Department of Public Works is a service afforded by the City which is of substantial benefit to owners of all properties within the City to which the service is extended. **§19.405 Deposit of Rubbish and Waste Matter Regulated.**

Any petition granted under this section will bind the property owner to continue the service for the remainder of time the property owner owns the property.

The Director of Public Works will notify the property owner of the granting of the petition and of the irrevocability of the provision of service. Those owners of residential properties without concrete curbs and gutters whose petitions are approved by the Director of Public Works under this section shall receive the service at the times and in the manner prescribed by this article for owners of residential properties with concrete curbs and gutters, or in such other manner as mandated by the Director of Public Works.

Garden refuse produced on residential properties not provided garden refuse collection and disposal services by City forces shall not be deposited in the streets of the City.

No garden refuse shall at any time be placed for collection in a manner which shall: (a) impede traffic or constitute a hazard to traffic; (b) impede the flow of water through any drainage channel or in any manner impede the drainage of water; or (c) be on or impede any public sidewalk or other public walkway. The owner of any residential property on which three or more dwelling units are located may elect to be charged the Lawn and Garden Service Fee as if it were being used primarily for non-residential purposes for the sole purpose of establishing the rate to be paid for such property; provided, in no event shall any such election establish an exemption from the Lawn and Garden Service Fee. Said election shall be filed with the Director of Public Works on such form as may be prescribed by the Director of Public Works and said election shall remain in effect until revoked in writing by the owner or the owner's successors in interest. Provided further that said election shall not exempt the owner from payment of the portion of the fee attributable to street sweeping, which portion shall be billed to and paid by the owner. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 3875, §20; Ord. 90-031, §1)

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GARBAGE, RUBBISH, WEEDS AND WASTE MATTER

§ 19.414 Same-Collection of Fees.

The Lawn and Garden Service Fee shall be billed and collected in accordance with the provisions of chapter 64 of the Sacramento City Code. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 3813, §1; Ord. 90-031, §1)

§ 19.415 Neighborhood Cleanup Programs.

Rubbish and waste matter may be deposited in the City streets for collection and removal by City forces when such deposits are expressly authorized by the Director of Public Works in connection with a neighborhood cleanup program. The time and manner of deposit, together with any limitation upon the nature and extent of materials to be deposited, shall be determined by the Director of Public Works and shall be communicated by the Director of Public Works to the neighborhood in which the program is to be conducted. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 3813, §1; Ord. 90-031, §1)

§ 19.416 Bare Lot and Multiple Use Property Classifications; Fees; Lawn and Garden Service Fees; Lawn and Garden Service Fee Classification Board.

- (a) **Definition.** For the purpose of this section only, the term "residential property" shall mean and refer to residential property classified for the purposes of this Article IV in a classification established by section 19.403 excluding multiple family dwelling units having 51 and greater dwelling units.
- (b) **Application.** Any owner of residential property may apply for reclassification of such property according to the procedures set forth in this section. Any such application shall be filed on forms provided by the City and shall be filed with the revenue division of the City. (Ord. 90-031, §1)
- (c) **Lawn and garden service fee classification board.** The Lawn and Garden Service Fee Classification Board shall be composed of two members, one of whom shall be from the Department of Finance and one of whom shall be from the Department of Public Works. The membership of the Board shall be appointed by, and shall serve at the pleasure of the City Manager. The Board shall process all applications under and make the classifications of property described by this section. (Ord. 90-031, §1)
- (d) **Classifications.** In addition to the classifications established by section 19.403(a), there shall be two additional classifications of residential property. These two classifications shall be:

**Bare lot:** The bare lot classification shall include only residential property which, by virtue of the fact that it has no vegetation outside the dwelling unit, will not produce any garden refuse. The term "outside the dwelling unit" shall mean outside the surface of the exterior surfaces. The term "exterior surfaces" shall mean those surfaces of the dwelling unit on the

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exterior perimeter through at least one of which persons customarily and reasonably enter or exit the dwelling unit.

**Multiple use lot:** The multiple use lot classification shall include only parcels of residential property on which different types of use occur (e.g. residential and commercial) such that two or more different lawn and garden service fees according to classification rather than rate are collected on the property. No property exceeding one-quarter acre shall be classified in this classification.

In no event shall classification in either of these classes qualify any property for any other classification or fee.

- (e) **Fees.** Any property classified on the bare lot classification shall pay the lawn and garden service fee imposed by this article of \$0.00 per month. Any property classified in the multiple use lot classification shall pay the lawn and garden service fee imposed by this article equal to the single highest fee which would be imposed on any one structure located on the property according to the other classifications in this article. Such fee shall be charged to the owner of the entire parcel of property.
  
- (f) **Processing applications and classifications.** The Board shall process all applications for classification in the bare lot and multiple use lot classifications. Each application shall initially be referred to the Department of Public Works which shall inspect the property and report the results of such inspection to the Board. The Board shall evaluate each application based on the information contained in such application and the Department of Public Works report and shall determine the proper classification for each such property. In the event the Board determines that the proper classification for such property is either the bare lot or the multiple use lot classification, regardless of the date such determination is made, the effective date of the classification shall be the date the application was submitted to the revenue division. In the event the lawn and garden service fee collected by the City after the effective date of the classification exceeds the fee prescribed by this article, such excess shall be refunded to the then owner of the property as shown on the records of the revenue division as of the date of the refund. (Ord. 90-031, §1)
  
- (g) **Notices and hearings.** In the event a property for which application for classifications is made pursuant to this section is not reclassified, notice shall be given to the applicant which shall briefly specify the reason for the decision of the Board. Any applicant who receives such notice who desires to have the application reconsidered by the Board may apply for a hearing before the Board. Any such application must be filed with the revenue division within fifteen calendar days of the date of the notice that the property was not reclassified. The Board shall within 30 calendar days after an application for hearing schedule a hearing upon ten days written notice to the applicant. The applicant may be present at such hearing and may present any evidence relevant to the classification of the property. The Board shall reevaluate the classification and shall classify the property in the classification which it shall deem proper in light of the application, the report of the

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Department of Public Works and the evidence submitted by the applicant at the hearing. In considering the application on rehearing the Board may obtain a supplemental inspection report from the Department of Public Works. Written notice of the action of the Board shall be given to the applicant and the classification established by the Board shall be final except as herein otherwise provided. (Ord. 90-031, §1)

- (h) **Reclassification upon changed circumstances.** In the event the nature of any property classified in the bare lot or multiple use lot classifications changes such that it is no longer properly classified in such classification, the Board may reclassify the property into an appropriate classification after written notice to the property owner and a reasonable opportunity to the property owner to be heard on such reclassification. (Ord. 3685, §4; Ord. 4089, §1; Ord. 88-072; Ord. 90-031, §1)

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Section 2

The Lawn and Garden Refuse Excise Tax established by Chapter 19, Section 19.412 is repealed effective April 1, 1991.

Section 3

This ordinance shall take effect on April 1, 1991, and shall apply to lawn and garden services received on or after April 1, 1991.
