SUBJECT: MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY WATER AGENCY AND REGIONAL SANITATION DISTRICT FOR COST-SHARING OF COORDINATED STORMWATER MONITORING PROGRAM (\$100,000)

SUMMARY

This report recommends that the City Council approve a Memorandum of Understanding with the Sacramento Regional Sanitation District and the Sacramento County Water Agency to apportion the costs of a consultant services contract for a Coordinated Water Quality Monitoring Program. The apportioned cost to the City is twenty-five percent (25%), or \$100,000; the total cost of the contract is estimated to be \$400,000.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The coordinated monitoring program was developed by the Sacramento County Water Quality Division, the City of Sacramento Flood Control and Sewer Division, and the Sacramento County Water Resources Division. The purpose of this program is to standardize and coordinate all water quality monitoring of the Sacramento and American Rivers within the City and County of Sacramento. The scope of this program includes design and implementation of an ambient monitoring program for the Sacramento and American Rivers, development of an overall data management system, management and implementation of special studies, and overall project management.

A consultant services agreement with Larry Walker Associates, Inc., in association with Brown and Caldwell Consultants, to conduct a coordinated monitoring program was approved by the Sacramento Regional Sanitation District on April 9, 1991. Services to be provided under the agreement include the following:

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1. Coordinate water quality monitoring efforts currently underway.
2. Recommend an ambient monitoring program for the Sacramento and American Rivers.
3. Design and manage a coordinated database for water quality monitoring results for the rivers.
4. Recommend additional monitoring programs which may be necessitated by future regulatory requirements.

On May 28, 1991, the Sacramento County Water Agency approved a resolution to execute a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding apportionment of costs for the coordinated monitoring program (see Attachment 1). The Sacramento Regional Sanitation District will consider approving a similar resolution on July 9, 1991.

Participation by the City of Sacramento is important because it will facilitate proper data collection and coordination between City water quality monitoring activities and other studies. City water quality monitoring activities include the monitoring programs required by both the National Pollution Elimination System (NPDES) Stormwater Discharge Permit and the Combined System Permit. The coordinated monitoring program also will facilitate collection of ambient river quality data, which is important for the assessment of water quality conditions in the Sacramento area. This data also will form the basis for wasteload allocation and determination of site specific objectives pursuant to the Inland Surface Waters Plan.

FINANCIAL DATA

The total cost of the contract is for an amount not to exceed \$400,000. The Memorandum of Understanding specifies that the City's share will be twenty-five percent (25%), which is \$100,000. There are sufficient funds budgeted in the operations budget of the Flood Control and Sewer Division of the Public Works Department to fund the City's projected costs under this Memorandum of Understanding (425-320-3262-4258).

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This contract facilitates the efforts of the City to comply with the requirements of the NPDES Stormwater Discharge Permit, the NPDES Combined System Permit, and the Inland Surface Waters Plan. These are federally mandated programs under the Clean Water Act.

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MBE/WBE EFFORTS

Consultant was selected by the County of Sacramento in accordance with established MBE/WBE guidelines. Neither Larry Walker Associates, Inc. or Brown and Caldwell Consultants are MBE/WBE firms.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council approve the attached resolution to authorize the Mayor to sign and the City Clerk to execute the attached Memorandum of Understanding with the Sacramento County Water Agency and the Regional Sanitation District to share the costs of the coordinated monitoring program.

Subject: Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding apportionment of costs for coordinated monitoring program.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that your Board approve the attached Resolution authorizing the Chairperson to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District and the City of Sacramento regarding apportionment of costs for the coordinated monitoring program on the Sacramento and American Rivers.

Discussion:

On April 9, 1991, the Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District Board approved an agreement with Larry Walker Associates, Inc., in association with Brown and Caldwell Consultants, to conduct a coordinated river monitoring program (see attachment "A"). The program participants sharing in the cost of this program are the Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District (50%), the City of Sacramento (25%), and the Sacramento County Water Agency (25%). The Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District has been designated as the lead agency.

The Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District, the City of Sacramento and the Sacramento County Water Agency currently conduct independent water quality monitoring programs in the Sacramento metropolitan area. The coordination of monitoring efforts will promote efficiency and consistency in producing the required monitoring information. The participants and the general public will benefit by the identification, development and performance of a coordinated water quality monitoring program necessary to accurately assess water quality conditions in the Sacramento metropolitan area.

The attached MOU provides the cost apportionment for the program under provisions of the MOU. The Sacramento County Water Agency's share of the attached consultant agreement is \$100,000 with the total contract cost ceiling being \$400,000. The MOU has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

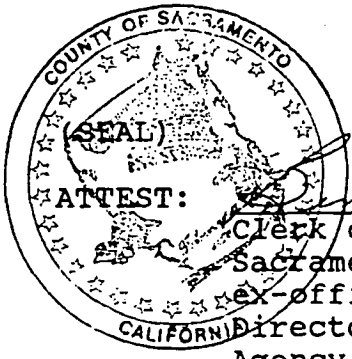
