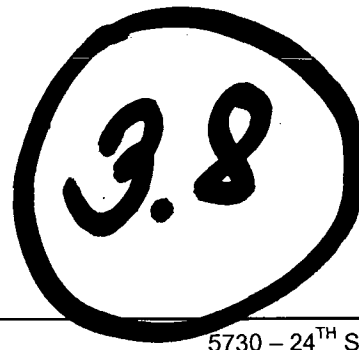
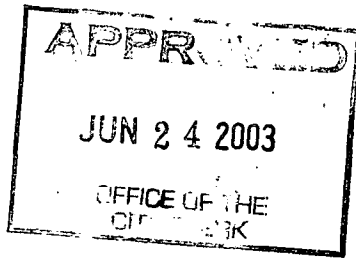

**SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS, ACCEPTANCE OF BID AND CONTRACT AWARD FOR CRACK SEALING STREETS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS**

**LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: All Districts**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

This report recommends that the City Council:

- Approve the plans and specifications;
- Accept the bid of Intermountain Slurry Seal Inc. in the amount of \$2,032.00 per ton applied; and
- Authorize the City Manager to execute a contract for Crack Sealing Streets at Various Locations

**SUMMARY:**

Crack sealing is a process required in preparation for the City's annual seal coat and overlay program. Street Operations' contract for crack sealing streets includes various locations throughout the City already identified for the next annual street-resurfacing program.

**COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:**

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

- The Street Maintenance Operation budget annually allocates \$300,000 for the delivery of street crack sealing maintenance.
- This project was advertised and bids as summarized below were received on April 16, 2003. The total bid amount is based on 120 tons of crack seal product applied.

Pagni Construction Inc.	\$2,380.00	100% certified SBE

Valley Slurry Seal Co.	\$3,296.00	Non responsive

- The construction estimate is \$300,000.
- Approval of the plans and specifications and award to Intermountain Slurry Seal Inc. is recommended as the lowest responsive bidder.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

- The project budget is \$300,000.00
- The Street Maintenance Operations Fiscal Year 2003-04 operating budget will provide the necessary Measure A Maintenance funds (Fund 207) for this contract award.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The current project has been determined to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under section 15301 (c) which states that repair and maintenance of existing highways and streets involving negligible or no expansion of existing use is exempt.


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

The action requested herein is consistent with Sacramento City Code, Title 03. This project helps to meet the City goals to "enhance and preserve the neighborhoods" and to "improve and diversify the transportation system."

**ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:**

The project was advertised under formal procedures. The Plans and Specifications were provided free of charge, and were mailed to identified contractors certified with the City's Office of Small Business Development. Additionally, plans were sent to 9 plan rooms and construction service organizations for publication and use. The project was advertised on the Public Works Web Site and on the Project Information Line. All bidders were encouraged to certify with the Office of Small Business Development. One of the successful bidders is certified with the City's Small or Emerging Business Enterprise program. The responsive low bid contractor will be using certified subcontractors for 20% of the contract value. The payment and performance bond requirement was established at \$25,000 each, to allow broader participation.


