

Sacramento, California,

November 13, 1930.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 7:20 o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman and Chenu.
ABSENT : None.

The minutes of the previous meeting of the special session of October 31, 1930, was dispensed with.

Mrs. Olive Silveria presented a letter to the Secretary of the Board, which was read. Mrs. Silveria was given a hearing in which she stated that her residence had always been outside of the city and that she had registered to vote outside of the City of Sacramento. Mrs. Silveria further stated that she had been informed by Mr. Nelson and others that if she slept within the city limits of the City of Sacramento three nights a week, she would qualify as a resident of the City of Sacramento. After reading the letter and hearing the statements made by Mrs. Silveria, she was informed by the Board that she was not eligible for a position in the city service because of her admitted residence outside of the City of Sacramento.

Commissioner Weisman moved that the letter presented to the Board by Mrs. Silveria be made a part of the minutes and a copy of the letter and that portion of the minutes concerning the case be transmitted to the City Manager for his information. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Maloney and the vote was as follows:

Gentlemen:

As an employee of the City for the past two years temporarily, working off and on in the Auditor's and Assessor's Office, averaging approximately eight months out of the year.

On October 2, 1930, I was laid off by someone making a complaint for not living inside of the City Limits.

On account of my mothers illness, I lived out with her, and was told if I averaged three or four nights staying in the City each week I would still hold my position and rating on the Civil Service list.

Complying with the above instructions I am at a loss to know why I should be the only one to lose my rating in the Civil Service when a dozen or more are holding positions under the same conditions.

I therefore feel that I should be accorded the same consideration as others being protected by the rating of the Civil Service Board.

Commissioner Maloney moved that the Secretary be instructed to present at each meeting of the Civil Service Board a report of all new placements made in the city service. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman, and the vote was as follows:

A communication was received from Carl F. Schneider requesting his reinstatement in the city service. Commissioner Weisman moved that this matter be referred to the City Manager. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Maloney, and the vote was as follows:

NOES: None.

A petition was received in the matter of the application of J. A. Dorr for reinstatement for Patrolman, signed by B. E. Gaddis, Attorney for petitioner. Commissioner Weisman moved that the petition be placed on file. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Maloney, and the vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman and Chenu.
NOES: None.

Commissioner Weisman moved that Mr. Dorr be advised through his attorney, Mr. B. E. Gaddis, that the Board was without authority in the case. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Maloney, and the vote was as follows:

The Board next proceeded to review the applications on file with the Civil Service Department for Policeman and Fireman.

Adjournment was taken at 11:00 o'clock P. M. to meet again at the call of the Chair.
