SUBJECT: Status of Federal and State Capital Improvement Grant Funds

### SUMMARY

This report provides information relating to the recent sale of State Parkland bonds and loss of Federal grant funding, which will seriously affect the Community Services Capital Improvement program. This report is informational in nature and requires no Council action at this time.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Federal and State grant programs are a major source of funds for Community Services Capital Improvement projects. The California Parklands Act of 1980; the Nejedly-Hart State, Urban and Coastal Park Act of 1976; and the Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund program (LAWCON) are three of these grant programs which are identified in the Capital Improvement Program budget as funding sources.

On November 4, 1981, the State of California sold \$30 million of bonds authorized under the California Parklands Act of 1980 and \$15 million of bonds authorized under the Nejedly-Hart State, Urban and Coastal Park Act of 1976. The City will benefit by receiving funds under these two programs for projects authorized in the 1981-82 Capital Improvement Program budget.

Recent U.S. House and Senate Conference Committee action has eliminated the 1981-82 Federal Land and Water Conservation program. It is difficult at this time to assess the future of the entire grant program.

The following 1981-82 Capital Improvement projects will be affected by the sale of the State parkland bonds and the loss of the LAWCON funds:

Staff is investigating alternative funding sources for the above projects affected by the loss of LAWCON funds and will provide recommendations for Capital Improvement Program budget amendments.

Since the future of the LAWCON grant program is questionable, the staff will begin investigating other funding sources for capital projects which have been identified for fiscal years 1982-83 through 1986-87. These projects include:

### FINANCIAL DATA

The City will receive \$916,016 from the sale of State parkland bonds. These funds have been appropriated in the 1981-82 Capital Improvement Program budget. Elimination of the 1981-82 LAWCON grant program results in a \$670,000 shortfall for Capital Improvement projects appropriated in the 1981-82 CIP budget.
