

## HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL,

CITY OF SACRAMENTO,

SEPTEMBER 29th, 1921.

The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.20 o'clock P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding, and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:

Anderson, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Sullivan.

Arrived later: Bidwell, Lindley.

Absent: Wilder.

Upon request of Acting City Clerk, the Minutes of Regular Meeting of September 22nd, 1921 were dispensed with.

----- A report from City Manager of the appointment of E. C. Haskins in charge of the collection and office department of Garbage Division, effective September 26th, 1921, at a salary of \$200.00 per month was ordered filed, and Councilman Brown moved that action be approved. Seconded by Councilman Funke and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

----- C. W. McKillip, District Manager of the Pacific Gas & Electric Company addressed Council requesting further extension of 90 days time for the purpose of re-laying street railway tracks on a portion of Riverside Boulevard.

Councilman Funke moved that extension of time for re-laying of said tracks be granted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

----- Communication from City Manager recommending appointment of Lee Darwin, Manager of the Wilkes Theatre, 1117 - 7th Street, as Special Police, was ordered filed.

Councilwoman Lindley moved that appointment be approved. Seconded by Councilman Anderson and carried by following vote:

Councilman Funke moved that report be filed and made a matter of record, and action of City Treasurer in sale of foregoing filtration bonds be approved. Seconded by Councilman Bidwell and

carried by following vote:

----- Communication from Secretary of Americanization Council, inviting members of the City Council to attend reception to be given new citizens on Monday evening October 3rd at Community Club was accepted, Mayor Elkus requesting members of Council to attend.

Summons and complaint in action brought by Charles Thorpe versus City of Sacramento for amount in sum of \$210.00 served upon the Mayor was by him presented and Councilman Bidwell moved that matter be referred to City Attorney with power to act. Seconded by Councilman Anderson and carried by following vote:

----- Councilman Funke introduced the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, it will be necessary, in order to promptly carry out the conditions and requirements of the recent Garbage Ordinance, No. 17, Fourth Series, passed by this Council, to employ equipment for the collection of the garbage, and  
WHEREAS, Tim Anspach of Sacramento, California, has presented to Albert Givan, Esq., City Engineer, a proposal regarding rental of horses to the City of Sacramento for such purpose, and  
WHEREAS, an emergency exists in avoiding accumulation of refuse and decaying matter in the streets, and to the end that the same may be attended to without delay,  
IT IS RESOLVED, that in pursuance with Section 14 of Ordinance No. 17, Fourth Series, Clyde E. Deavey, City Manager, be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to make, execute and deliver with said Tim Anspach for the hiring and rental of horses, upon such terms and conditions as said City Manager may deem for the best interests of the City of Sacramento.

This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, such emergency being the necessity of providing the proper equipment for the collection and disposal of garbage for carrying on the City Government in the Garbage Division thereof; and shall take effect immediately on the date of its passage.

Councilman Funke moved that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

----- Councilman Funke introduced the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, it will be necessary, in order to promptly carry out the provisions and requirements of the recent Garbage Ordinance, No. 17, Fourth Series, passed by this Council September 22nd, 1921, so as not to delay the proper conducting and regulation of the business mentioned in said Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to make immediate purchase of proper office equipment and supplies to be used in said Garbage Division, all of which has been recommended by the City Manager, therefore,

IT IS RESOLVED, that in pursuance with Section 14 of Ordinance No. 17, Fourth Series, Clyde E. Deavey, City Manager, be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to make, execute and deliver a Contract for the purchase of such office supplies, material and equipment, upon such terms and conditions as said City Manager may deem for the best interests of the City of Sacramento.

This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, such emergency being the necessity of providing the proper office equipment and supplies and machinery for carrying on the City Government in the Garbage Division thereof, and shall take effect immediately on the date of its passage.

Councilman Funke moved that Resolution be adopted, and City Clerk authorized to advertise for bids to be received on date of October 13th, 1921, for foregoing office equipment. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

----- Councilman Funke introduced the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, there remains of the Sacramento River Filtration Bonds, contracted to be purchased by the Coast Construction Company, Bonds Nos. 671, maturing 1935, to 732, maturing 1937, inclusive, and Bonds Nos. 1207, maturing 1947, to 1268, maturing 1949, inclusive, totalling the sum of \$124,000.00, which bonds under the contract between the City of Sacramento and the said Coast Construction Company, and the extension of said contract which is extended by Resolution No. 1835, adopted May 24th, 1921, are to be purchased and delivered on the 31st day of August, 1921, and;  
WHEREAS, at the present time there is unencumbered, the sum of \$238,914.00 in the Filtration Fund, which amount is sufficient to pay all obligations arising from the construction of the Filtration Plant until the first day of October, 1921, provided no unforeseen contingency arises in

the meantime, and;

WHEREAS, the \$124,000.00 to be raised by the sale of said bonds will not be needed prior to October, 1921, as aforesaid, and that a sale and delivery of said bonds at this time will result in a loss to the City of Sacramento by way of interest payments at the rate of 4½ per cent per annum up to the time the said money is needed for the payment of the obligations arising from the construction of said filtration plant:

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED, that with the consent of the said Coast Construction Company, the purchase and delivery of said Sacramento River Filtration Bonds be postponed until the 9th day of October, 1921, provided, however, that in the event of some unforeseen contingency arising before said time by reason of which it becomes necessary for the money to be immediately raised, the Coast Construction Company, will on not less than three days notice, from the City Manager, purchase the said bonds and pay the purchase price thereof into the City Treasury according to the terms of the aforesaid contract.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon filing with the City Clerk of a written consent by the Coast Construction Company to said postponement, this Resolution shall take effect as a postponement of said sale until the said 9th day of October, 1921, subject to the contingency above set out.

Councilman Funke moved that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Bidwell and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan,

Absent: Wilder.

----- Communication from Wallace A. Salmon requesting extension of one week in which to render report, as expert on City records was ordered filed and Councilwoman Lindley moved that extension of one week in accordance with request of said Salmon, be granted. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

----- City Manager addressed Council relative to various lines of businesses, the licenses for which required petition to City Council, stating that matter should be further investigated by members of the Council.

Councilman Funke moved that action thereon be postponed one week. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

----- Following Ordinance was finally considered:

ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_, 4th SERIES.

An Ordinance requiring Physicians and Surgeons, also superintendents, proprietors or other persons in charge of any public or private hospital, sanitarium, drug store, or house, or any other person within the City of Sacramento, to keep a record of aid or treatment given to, as well as to report to the Chief of Police, any person who has become an inmate or patient of, or who has been brought into such hospital, sanitarium or drug store, or house, for treatment for any wound or other injury; making a violation of this ordinance a misdemeanor and providing a penalty therefor.

Councilman Funke moved that Ordinance be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Sullivan and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

Thereupon this Ordinance became known and numbered as Ordinance No. 19 - 4th Series.

----- Following Ordinance was finally considered:

ORDINANCE No. \_\_\_\_\_, FOURTH SERIES.

An Ordinance prohibiting the advertising or carrying on of the business of fortune telling or business similar thereto, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Councilman Funke moved that Ordinance be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Brown, and after discussion Ordinance was adopted by following vote:

Ayes: Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

No: Anderson.

Absent: Wilder.

Thereupon this Ordinance became known and numbered as Ordinance No. 20 - 4th Series.

----- With consent of Council, the Mayor ordered Ordinances on the following subjects heretofore

introduced to lay over one week, viz:

Police Department, Fire Department, and Clerk of Police Court.

Councilman Bidwell introduced the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, that the City Manager prepare and present to the City Council, necessary Resolution of Intention for the improvement of Y Street from Sacramento Boulevard to 34th Street.

Councilman Bidwell moved that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Anderson and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

Councilman Bidwell introduced the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, that the City Manager prepare and present to the City Council necessary Resolution of Intention for the improvement of 35th Street from Y Street to Sacramento Boulevard.

Councilman Bidwell moved that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Anderson and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

With consent of Council, the Mayor further continued for two weeks hearing on Commissioners report for opening of M Street 37th to 38th Streets.

This being the date set for hearing of protests against the improvement of 5th Street Q to 10th Street, under provisions of Resolution of Intention No. 1355, Western Pacific Railway Company present protest, and Councilman Kiernan moved that said protest be filed. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

Councilwoman Lindley moved that final action on foregoing street improvement be postponed one week. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

Upon request of City Manager, further time was granted him to determine matter which had been referred to him to make recommendations relative to petition of D. F. Reid to construct frame lodging house on 2nd between P and Q Streets, location thereof being within fire limits.

Bids were received from Pacific Gas & Electric Company and Great Western Power Company for furnishing

**MINIMUM CHARGE:**

The yearly minimum charge which is payable in equal monthly installments shall be equal to twelve times the maximum monthly demand charge, but in no event shall this annual minimum charge be less than \$6,000.00.

Councilman Kiernan addressed Council relative to necessity of resurfacing a portion of lower T Street and matter was referred to City Manager.

----- The repair of V Street from 25th to 30th Streets, upon request of Councilman Bidwell was referred to City Manager.

----- Councilman Funke addressed Council emphasizing the need of a civic auditorium in the City of Sacramento and moved that report on investigation as to feasibility of considering at present, project of a memorial auditorium be requested of City Manager. Seconded by Councilman Sullivan and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder.

----- Councilman Funke presented to the Council matter of taking steps to retain five cent fares on certain street railway lines in the City, and moved that matter be referred to a Committee of three to investigate and make recommendations to Council as to matter of changing street railway franchises in order to hold the said nominal fares. Seconded by Councilman Brown and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Funke, Kiernan, Lindley, Sullivan.

Absent: Wilder, the Mayor thereupon appointing the following Committee:

Councilman Funke, Chairman, Councilman Wilder and Councilwoman Lindley.

----- Councilwoman Lindley addressed Council relative to condition of certain streets, resulting from excavations refilled by City Tapper, which matter was referred to City Manager.

----- Before Adjournment, Council carefully compared bids received on this date with record of same kept by City Clerk, and found record and bids to be similar in every particular.

----- Council Adjourned at 9.25 o'clock P. M.
