

ORDINANCE NO. 711, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 78 OF ORDINANCE NO. 18, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED SEPTEMBER 22, 1921, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE CARRYING ON OF CERTAIN PROFESSIONS, TRADES, CALLINGS AND OCCUPATIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND MAKING THIS AN EMERGENCY MEASURE, TO TAKE EFFECT OCTOBER 1ST, 1921." AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 670, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED JUNE 27 1935.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. Section 78 of Ordinance No. 18, Fourth Series, passed September 22 1921, is hereby amended to read as follows:

RESTAURANTS

SECTION 78. For every person, firm or corporation conducting, managing or carrying on the business of caterer or restaurant, or other place where meals or luncheons are served to be consumed upon the premises, the gross receipts of which business amounts to:

\$5,000 or less per quarter, \$15.00 per quarter.

\$5,001 and less than \$12,500 per quarter, \$21.00 per quarter.

\$12,501 and up per quarter, \$24.00 per quarter,

provided that it shall be unlawful in said places of business to cause or permit to be played any musical instrument between the hours of 11 P.M. and 9 A.M. next ensuing, except with the written consent of the City Manager under such conditions as he deems not inimical to peace, good order and public welfare; such permit may be revoked by said City Manager upon violation of such conditions or if, in the judgement of said City Manager, such permit becomes detrimental to the public good;

Provided, however, this shall not apply to such places of business now holding a bona fide permit to conduct dancing heretofore granted by the City Council, which may continue in force.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 670, Fourth Series, passed June 27 1935 is hereby repealed.
