SUMMARY

This report recommends that the City enter into an agreement with the Greater Sacramento Softball Association, a non-profit organization applying for grant funds to improve a City facility.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Greater Sacramento Softball Association is the local governing body of the Amateur Softball Association and a non-profit support organization of the Department of Parks and Community Services. The Association wishes to apply for grant funds, as appropriated by the California Park and Recreation Facilities Act of 1984, to rehabilitate the softball diamond at Redwood Park.

The scope of the project is as follows:

1. Replace the fabric on the existing backstop.
2. Remove the existing overthrow fencing along first and third base. Install overthrow fencing at a height of twelve (12) feet for increased spectator protection and safety.
3. Install a vinyl covered outfield fence extending from the left field overthrow fence to the right field overthrow fence; at a distance of 250 feet in left and right fields, 265 feet in center field, and at a height of six (6) feet.
4. Purchase and install a new electric scoreboard.
5. Install a flagpole.


FINANCIAL DATA
