SUMMARY

At the meeting of April 6, 1982, the Council requested the attached resolution to the State Department of Health Services and the State Water Quality Control Board in response to the SACOG report on hazardous waste in the SACOG region.

DISCUSSION

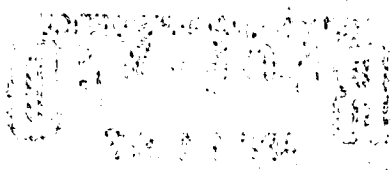
The resolution for the State Department of Public Health requests the Department to provide the City with:

- (1) information on the type, amount and disposal location of hazardous wastes;
- (2) a list of hazardous waste facilities in the City which have received interim permits; and,
- (3) copies of new hazardous waste facility applications before permits are granted.

The resolution also requests the State Department of Health Services to develop a 24-hour hazardous material identification response capability and, together with the State Water Quality Control Board, a management and monitoring program relating to the underground storage of hazardous materials.

The resolution for the State Water Quality Control Board requests the Board to develop the above program regarding underground storage of hazardous materials in conjunction with the State Department of Health Services.

1. The first part of the document discusses the importance of maintaining accurate records of all activities.



2. The second part of the document details the specific procedures and protocols that must be followed.

3. The following section outlines the key responsibilities and roles of all personnel involved in the process.

4. It is essential that all staff members are thoroughly trained and understand their duties at all times.

5. Regular communication and reporting are required to ensure that all operations are running smoothly.

6. Any deviations from the established procedures should be reported immediately to the appropriate authority.

7. The final part of the document provides a summary of the overall goals and objectives of the program.


8. It is the responsibility of all participants to adhere to these guidelines and ensure the highest level of performance.

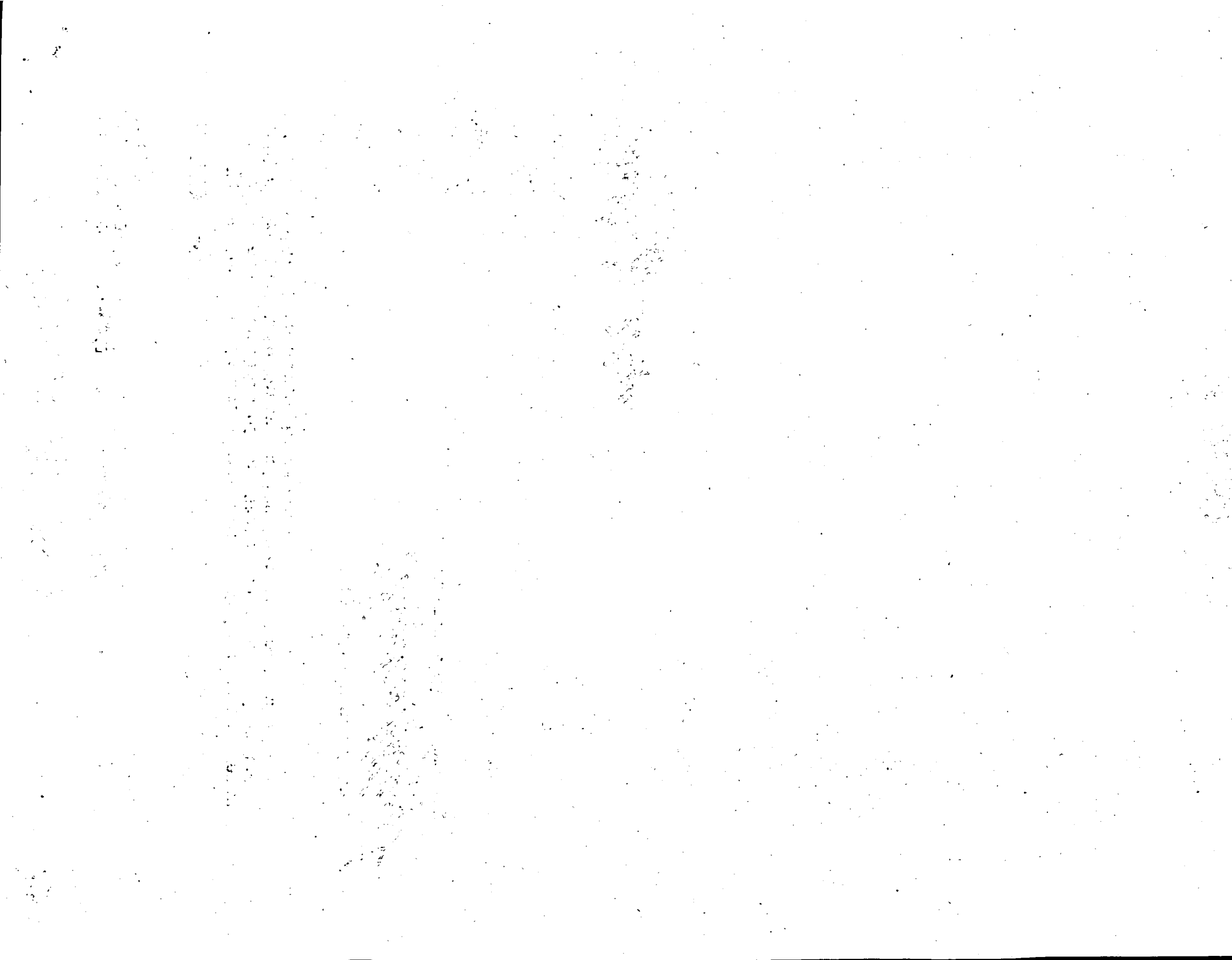

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE STATE
WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD TO
DEVELOP A PROGRAM FOR THE MANAGING
AND MONITORING OF THE UNDERGROUND
STORAGE OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

WHEREAS, a managing and monitoring program for the underground storage of hazardous materials is needed; and,

WHEREAS, the State Water Quality Control Board can develop such a program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO AS FOLLOWS:

That the State Water Quality Control Board is hereby requested to develop a program for the managing and monitoring of the underground storage of hazardous materials in conjunction with the State Department of Health Services.

RESOLUTION NO. 82-288

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION REQUESTING CERTAIN INFORMATION FROM AND ACTION OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES REGARDING HAZARDOUS WASTE AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento needs the information requested herein in order to properly plan for and respond to emergencies involving hazardous wastes and land use issues pertaining to the location of hazardous waste facility sites within the City; and,

WHEREAS, the State Department of Health Services possesses the information requested herein; and,

WHEREAS, a program of managing and monitoring the underground storage of hazardous materials is necessary in order to prevent leakage into surrounding water supplies; and,

WHEREAS, the State Department of Health Services can develop such a program for underground storage of hazardous materials;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO AS FOLLOWS:

That the State Department of Health Services be and it is hereby requested:

1. To transmit to the City on a regular basis information on the type, amount, and disposal location for hazardous wastes generated within their area, which the State receives through the State mandated hazardous waste manifest system;
2. To provide to the City a list of hazardous waste facilities located within their boundaries that have received interim hazardous waste facility permits, a copy of the complete permit application for each facility, and an indication of which facilities were inspected prior to permit issuance;
3. To transmit to the City complete copies of new hazardous waste facility permit applications for facilities to be located in the City, prior to issuing a permit;
4. To develop a 24-hour hazardous material identification response capability that would be available to assist local cities and counties in emergency incidents; and,
5. To develop with the State Water Quality Control Board a management and monitoring program to control the underground storage of hazardous materials and prevent leakage into surrounding water supplies.
