Emalene Vaughn

Vaughn: My name is Emalene Vaughn. I live on Arcade Blvd. and there's four issues that I've got a signed petition by all the people on the block that I live on. And there's four things we would like to have done to that particular street.

The first one being that there's one house in particular that's been hit on an average of one time each week and the cars have just knocked down the fence. We're right behind a school so the kids come speeding by and we would like a bump put in that street.

Same street on the corner of Arcade and Lineley we need a stop sign there. This is another intersection they just come around and we've had a couple of accidents there.

And also, same street, the city owns a vacant lot in between two of the houses and I think one house is, the address is 453 and I don't remember the other address on Arcade Blvd. And the city owns this property and there's just nothing there and last night somebody stole a car, they put it into this vacant lot and blew it up.

Also last week some kids came through there with shotguns and start shooting out the lights and we would like the city to do something about that lot.

Last item is behind the houses on Arcade Blvd. there's a levee that runs all the way down. And the kids get out of school.....consistently. And I would like to propose that the city would do something to block it off so the kids can not get up there after school and just consistently break in.

The house on one side of me has been broken into 25 times since the first of this year.

Fisher: You can't do anything with that levee. That's in the American River Flood Control. That's the problem there.

Isenberg: Let me just make a suggestion. Blaine, I know that this is in your district. We're not going to be able to get answers for you this evening.

Vaughn: Ok.

Isenberg: But what I would like to suggest is what Mr. Fisher and other councilmembers do is let the staff take a look at the problems. What we would like you to do. I think, Mr. Parker, most of these, some of these would be engineering problems. Traffic or other controls. Let us get your name, your address and telephone number. And I think what

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would happen is that staff would do the report. Mr. Fisher would you want to do a meeting in the neighborhood on this?

Fisher: Oh, I would be glad to. That one lot, the dumping lot which I know.

Vaughn: It's not a dumping lot.

Fisher: The one where they walk up where the car was blown up.

Thompson: It's not a legal dumping lot.

Vaughn: No.

Fisher: No, not a legal dumping one but I mean.

Vaughn: Will you define dumping lot to me then?

Fisher: No, the one that's going up. I'm talking about that you said that the city. It's a lot the kids use to cut across to going to school to get up on the....

Vaughn: Time's up (bell ranged)

Isenberg: Let me make this suggestion. If you would give your address and telephone number to Mr. Parker who's the gentlemen sitting there. Who's our City Engineer. He has most of the pieces of the action. Let us then get the material to our staff, various staff departments. We'll set up a meeting. We'll let Mr. Fisher coordinate a meeting. We'll get out a notice, either mail or hand carry, of the meeting to you and to all your neighbors. Blaine, do you want to have, it would be a meeting in the neighborhood, of course.

Fisher: It would be one of your homes or somewhere besides.

Isenberg: If you would be willing to do that.

Vaughn: Sure.

Isenberg: Then we'll come to your home, we'll talk to you about the problems and we'll go from there. Would you do that?

Vaughn: Sure.

Isenberg: And then, Mr. Parker, please. Thank you very much.
