SUBJECT: Maintenance of Art in Public Places Art Works - Amendment to Sacramento City Code Section 2.60-3(a)

SUMMARY

This report recommends that the Art in Public Places trust funds be utilized for the maintenance and repair of Art in Public Places art works. An amendment to Sacramento City Code Section 2.60-3(a) is necessary.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

With the implementation of the Art in Public Places ordinance (City Code Section 2.60-3), underway since 1979, nearly 30 works of art have been commissioned. In the coming years, the City's collection of public art will continue to grow. Although one of the major criteria in the selection of art works is minimal maintenance, works of art like buildings and other public facilities will need some maintenance and repair attention over the years. Since the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission is the designated agency to commission art work for the City, it is appropriate that this agency also assume the responsibility for the care of those commissioned works.

Since funds will eventually need to be provided for maintenance of commissioned art works, it is recommended that the trust funds be utilized for the maintenance and care of commissioned art works. It is intended that the trust fund interest earnings will underwrite the maintenance costs. This policy change requires an ordinance amendment to permit the expenditure of the Art in Public Places trust funds for maintenance or repair of art works.

The Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission, at its meeting of November 2, 1982, recommended the adoption of this policy by unanimous vote.

No additional funds are required. It is intended that the interest accrued to the APP trust fund will underwrite future maintenance and repair costs of commissioned art works.

RECOMMENDATION


