BACKGROUND INFORMATION: On September 20, 1989, the Board approved plans for exterior modifications to the west end of this Essential Structure, where it faces the relatively new parking lot at the corner of 23rd and L Streets. That work never commenced. The current proposal is much more ambitious. New sloped roof elements are proposed on that same west wall and the adjacent south wall, at both the first and second floors. Along the south wall will be an arcade. It will intersect with a new entrance arcade that is oriented toward the alley and the parking lot. The juncture of the arcades will be at the entrance of a new lobby extension.

PROJECT EVALUATION: Staff has the following comments regarding the proposed project:

 The new roof structures will achieve their purpose of providing sun shading. They will also achieve visual unity between the adjacent elevations. The applicant pointed out a discrepancy that occurs on both the south elevation and the perspective of the arcade as viewed from the alley. The new second floor roof element is shown on both drawings without the wrap-around at the corner, as is accurately shown on the west elevation. Staff notes further that the second floor plan is inconsistent with the other plans. In this case, the arcades below are properly shown. However, for the west wall it indicates the new roof above, which reaches the corner of the building, rather than the one below, which does not. Again, the west elevation drawing is a better reference.

2. The new arcades will further define the existing school play yard. The entrance arcade helps to identify the entrance to the new lobby. The new brick fence for the equipment area will not only serve its screening function but also contribute to the aesthetics and identity of that new building entrance.

The columns and pilasters on these new structures are designed to match the brick pillars of the wrought iron fencing that enclose the play yard.

3. Additional landscaping at the foot of the new brick wall for the equipment area would be desirable. The overhang area of the parking spaces could accommodate climbing vines. Such planting would further enhance the appearance of the brick wall and soften the starkness of the adjacent parking area.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of the proposed project subject to the following conditions:

- The overhang area of the parking space shall be utilized as a planter with climbing vines.
- 2. Revised plans, with corrections, and landscape and irrigation plans shall be submitted for staff review and approval. Staff will be assisted by the Board's landscape architect member in the review of the landscape and irrigation plans.


Approval is based on the following findings of fact:





#### DESCRIPTION

- 7a. Architectural style: Period Revival of English Gothic derivation
- 7b. Briefly describe the present *physical description* of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

The church complex is comprised essentially of three forms; the large three story auditorium/church building, the three and a half story tower, and the two story educational building south of the auditorium. The building uses both red and clinker brick, with pinkish terra cotta trim. The compound and highly decorated entry arch stands below the auditorium's large arched windows with Gothic tracery and stained glass. The large gable of the auditorium building is intersected by smaller north facing gables. Buttresses with gabled caps line the north elevation. The tower displays a highly decorative parapet of terra cotta and the educational wing is gabled with a large west window of unusual design. An arched cloister stands between the tower and the covered walkway connecting the church and school. Entrance and auditorium piers are castellated. A one story newer wing housing primary school functions and offices stands west of the auditorium. A fireescape has been added and various interior alterations have occurred.







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
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






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LOCATION OF NEW ABCADE
