

ORDINANCE NO. 423, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO RECONSTRUCT TWO TENNIS COURTS AT MCKINLEY PARK WITHOUT FIRST ADVERTISING FOR BIDS, AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO,
AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The proper authorities of the City of Sacramento are hereby authorized and directed to reconstruct two tennis courts at McKinley Park at an estimated cost of Fourteen Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$1,450.00), in accordance with specifications prepared by the Engineering Department, without first advertising for bids, such course having been recommended by the City Manager.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately, such emergency existing because there is not sufficient time to advertise for bids and award a contract for the construction of said tennis courts before they are required for the summer period, and it further appearing that no saving can be accomplished in the reconstruction of said tennis courts, even if bids were asked for.
