SUBJECT: Sacramento Zoo Master Plan

SUMMARY

This report provides information on the current status of the development of a master plan for the Sacramento Zoo and surrounding area and requests an FY 1986-87 City budget amendment to reflect a contribution by the Sacramento Zoological Society.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In June 1984, the City Council called for proposals for consultant services to undertake comprehensive study and master plan development of the Sacramento Zoo, Fairytale Town, and the surrounding area. In October 1984, the City of Sacramento entered into a consultant services agreement with zoo master planning experts, Wildlife Associates, Inc. to provide these services.

A staff task force comprised of Zoo, Parks and Administrative Services employees, under the guidance of the Zoo Superintendent, was created to advise and assist with the master planning process. Additional input was solicited from Police, Parking, Engineering and Planning staff regarding their various areas of expertise.

A Citizen's Advisory Committee, comprised of individuals representing various special interest groups and organizations interested in the master plan including the Zoological Society, Fairytale Town Board, Holy Spirit Elementary School, and Land Park residents, was appointed by the Director. This group, which met on a regular basis over a 13 month period, provided extensive input into the master plan process. Two public meetings, designed to solicit community input, were held in March and May of 1985. The response was overwhelming with an estimated 200 citizens attending the first meeting and approximately 400 persons attending the second meeting. Following these public meetings, the Citizen's Advisory Committee was expanded to include representation from the newly formed

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Association to Preserve Land Park. In addition to the continued efforts of the Citizen's Advisory Committee, a Director's Task Force comprised of members from the Zoological Society, Citizen's Advisory Committee, Association to Preserve Land Park, and Department of Parks and Community Services staff, was formed. Task force members, who provided extensive input into the planning process, were charged with ensuring the adequate representation of these interest groups.

Due to both the level of citizens' participation and the number of issues raised, the original project timeline was revised. It was expected that Wildlife Associates, Inc. would complete the draft master plan in May of 1986 after which an Environmental Impact Report would be prepared prior to finalization of the master plan.

In anticipation of receiving the draft master plan, the EIR process was begun. A Notice of Interest (NOI) was sent to over 150 environmental planning firms and a Request for Proposal for the preparation of the Zoo EIR was issued following the May 13, 1986 City Council authorization. Simultaneously, a Notice of Preparation (NOP) inviting public comment for the State mandated 30 day period was sent to all special interest organizations who had indicated an interest in the master plan as well as all neighbors residing within a five block radius of William Land Park. Responses to the NOP are on file pending selection of an EIR consultant in accordance with California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines. Nearly 30 environmental planning firms indicated their intention to submit proposals to prepare the EIR pending availability of the draft master plan.

However, Wildlife Associates failed to furnish the draft master plan document in accordance with the requirements of their consulting services contract. Repeated efforts by the Director's office, Zoo Superintendent and Department of Law to contact this Seattle based firm and to obtain the final draft document were unsuccessful. Consequently, the City has terminated the consultant services contract with Wildlife Associates and has referred the matter to the City Attorney for legal action.

Completion of the draft master plan documents can best be accomplished by contracting directly with the Portico Group, the landscape architect firm who was formerly the sub-contractor of Wildlife Associates. The consultant services agreement with the Portico Group is for the sum of \$13,000. In addition, it is necessary to contract with two local consultant firms for completion of the marketing and utility assessment components of the draft master plan. The Department will enter a consultant services agreement with J. D. Franz Research, Inc. for the sum of \$4,080 to provide the necessary market research services for the master plan and will contract with URS Corporation for the sum of \$6,300 to provide the engineering services related to the utility assessment segment of the master plan. Zoo and Administrative Services staff have been assigned to coordinate completion of this document.

It is anticipated that the draft master plan will be completed in April 1987 at which time the process of preparation of the EIR will resume. It is expected

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will be available in December 1987 and, following the required public review, will be presented to the appropriate City Council committees and to the full Council for certification in February 1988.

FINANCIAL DATA

The total cost of the consultant services contracts necessary to complete the draft Zoo Master Plan is as follows:

A transfer of appropriations in the amount of \$3,000 from the FY 1986-87 Zoo Division's Operating Budget, Other Professional Services, to the Zoo Master Plan CIP project (NA00) is necessary to fund these consulting services contracts. In addition, the Sacramento Zoological Society will contribute \$3,777 to the Zoo Master Plan CIP project (NA00) for these consultant services. Total funding for these consulting services contracts can be summarized as follows:

It is necessary to increase appropriations in the FY 1986-87 Zoo Master Plan CIP project (NA00) by a total of \$6,777 to reflect the contribution by the Sacramento Zoological Society and the transfer of appropriations from the FY 1986-87 Zoo Division's Operating Budget, Other Professional Services.

No additional City funds are required.

RECOMMENDATION


