Resolution Authorizing Agreements Between the City and Various

Subgrantee CETA Titles IID and VI Program Entitlements

SUMMARY

For Fiscal Year 1980-81 the Council adopted a budget of \$7,293,260 to support the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) programs for the City and its subgrantees to support approximately 658 positions.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On February 7, 1980 the City sent Requests for Proposals to all interested agencies. These proposals were to be submitted by May 16, 1980 in order to be considered for FY 80-81 funding. 102 proposals were received requesting 752 positions at a total cost of \$7,524,224.

The staff reviewed all the proposals and made recommendations to fund thirty-three (33) agencies totaling 263 positions for \$2,646,507 based on the Council's adopted guidelines.

The staff funding recommendations have been reviewed and approved by both the Sacramento Employment and Training Advisory Council Funding Committee and the Sacramento Employment and Training Advisory Council. Public testimony was received during both sessions.

On September 2, 1980, the Budget and Finance Committee conducted hearings on the nine appeals received protesting the Sacramento Employment and Training Advisory Council's (SETAC) funding recommendations. The Committee approved the SETAC's recommendations and the addition of 9 positions to be funded through four more agencies and directed staff to submit a report as to the source of the additional funding. The Committee also stated that if additional funds were received, the following agencies would be given funding priorities: (1) Chinese Community Center; (2) Community Resources Project: (3) County Welfare Program.

CONCLUSION

The attached resolution authorizes the execution of agreements between the City and various subgrantees for CETA Title IID and VI beginning October 1, 1980 to September 30, 1981. The agreements for the Northern California Women for Apprenticeship; Capitol Park Renters' Fund, Inc.; Sacramento Singleperson's Self Help Group; and one person for the Sacramento Science Center and Junior Museum will not be executed until the funding sources are identified.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution.
