SUBJECT: PURCHASE OF ONE (1) EACH TRUCK MOUNTED SEWER TELEVISION INSPECTION/RECORDING SYSTEM

SUMMARY

The Fleet Management Division has a requirement for the purchase of one (1) each truck mounted sewer television inspection/recording system to be used by the Water and Sewer Division. To provide the Water and Sewer Division interchangeability and compatibility with their existing equipment, the sole source purchase of this requirement is recommended.

BACKGROUND

On May 25, 1983, City Council authorized the purchase of a truck mounted sewer television inspection/recording and pipe joint testing/sealing system. This system has been in service for over two years, providing excellent service for the Water and Sewer Division. The FY 1985-86 Approved Budget includes an additional system. The purchase of an identical system would provide numerous advantages, as follows:

1. Interchangeability of components between systems.
2. Personnel would not require training on two systems.
3. No additional parts inventory would be necessary.
4. Maintenance personnel would not require additional training.
5. The system has a proven record of reliable service, with a minimum of downtime.
6. Only 3 inch camera with 2000 foot single conductor cable range in the industry.
7. Only company providing 3" camera with tractor conveyor system, which eliminates additional manpower and equipment necessary to provide tow line to pull camera through pipe.
8. Service is available in Sacramento.
9. Delivery is available within sixty (60) days.

A price of \$97,520 was received from Flexible Systems, Inc. for this requirement with a sixty (60) day delivery.


FINANCIAL DATA

The total cost of this requirement is \$97,520. Sufficient funds are available in the current 1985-86 Fiscal Year Budget.


RECOMMENDATION

SUBJECT: PURCHASE OF CLOSED CIRCUIT T.V. FOR SEWER INSPECTION

The City Council approved the purchase of an additional T.V. truck by resolution from the Pocket Sewer Maintenance Fund. The City's interest could best be served by purchasing a single conductor television system of the same make as we now own for the following reasons:

1. The two units would operate identically. This would eliminate training people for two different modes and allow the transfer of personnel between rigs without retraining.
2. Various components of the system would be interchangeable. This would allow us to use specialty components with either unit and not have to own duplicates.
3. Local service for this unit is available.
4. The single conductor system has eliminated approximately 50% of the town time we experienced with multi-conductor cables.
5. The purchase of this unit as quickly as possible in order to implement the I & I program.
