SUMMARY

SUBJECT:

It is requested that the City Council approve the various attached resolutions to initiate the proposed assessment district. Adoption of the resolutions and report is recommended which sets a hearing for June 28, 1988; bids to be received June 7, 1988.

BACKGROUND

On October 6, 1987, the Public Works Department reported to the Transportation and Community Development Committee on requests received by staff for three assessment districts to construct street lighting. It was recommended that the assessment districts be formed using the public convenience and necessity provisions of State law, which requires approval by four-fifths (4/5) vote of Council and would eliminate the circulation of a petition by property owners. Successful petition circulation is difficult when many property owners are involved. This assessment district is the second of the three proposed districts.

The proposed assessment project will provide street lighting in the area generally bounded by Tiverton Avenue on the north, 65th Avenue on the south, Amherst Street on the west and 15th Street on the east. The exact boundaries are shown on the attachment. On July 15, 1987 and March 23, 1988, Lynn Robie held neighborhood meetings to discuss the proposed lighting district. All of the people attending the meetings gave a favorable response to the proposed street lighting district.

Plans, specifications and the estimate have been completed together with the necessary report. We are ready to proceed with the formation of the assessment district. A Negative Declaration was filed with the County Clerk for this project on April 18, 1988.

SUNNARY

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Plans, specifications and the estimate have been completed together with the necessary report. We are ready to proceed with the formation of the assessment district. A Negative Declaration was filled with the County Clerk for this project on April 16. 1985.

The assessment district is estimated to cost \$51,247.68, and will include 96 parcels. The typical residential assessment will be approximately \$534 which is to be paid over a five year period. The typical semiannual cost to the residential property owner is estimated to be approximately \$57 plus interest on the unpaid balance.

After adoption of the attached resolutions, the following key actions will take place:

- 1. The posting of legal notices on or about May 23, 1988, advising the general public of the Council's assessment district formation hearing.
- 2. The mailing of a notice to property owners on or about May 23, 1988, informing each owner of the proposed assessment, explaining the project and the assessment district procedures.
- 3. Bids will be received on June 7, 1988.
- 4. The mailing of a letter on or about June 13, 1988, advising each property owner of an informational meeting with staff to further discuss the project and the proposed assessments.
- 5. The holding of the Council's public hearing on June 28, 1988, to form the assessment district. A four-fifths (4/5) Council vote will be required to approve the district.

FINANCIAL

The project, including all planning, design, construction and incidental expenses, is estimated to cost \$51,247.68 which will be charged to the property owners.

This project will be financed by the property owners within the district. The estimated costs are as follows:

Notice of Improvement quartercards will be provided to the Engineer of Work to post on all open streets within the boundaries of the district, not more than 300 feet apart. Only one side of street to be posted; and no less than three notices to be posted. This must be completed at least 20 days prior to hearing date (no later than June 8, 1988).

We will prepare copies of the Notice of Improvement for mailing to all property owners within the district and will send them to you for mailing prior to June 8, 1988.

- E. Notice Inviting Sealed Bids: We will publish in The Daily Recorder once a week for two consecutive weeks beginning prior to the initial public hearing scheduled for June 28, 1988. All bids must be submitted to the City Clerk's Office, 915 "I" Street, Room 300, Sacramento, no later than 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 7, 1988.

AGREEMENT FOR LEGAL SERVICES

WILLOW RANCHO STREET LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 3

This is an agreement for legal services between the City of Sacramento, a municipal corporation of the State of California, referred to as Client, and STURGIS, NESS, BRUNSELL & SPERRY a professional corporation, Attorneys at Law, Emeryville, California, referred to as Bond Counsel.

- 1. Client retains Bond Counsel as special counsel to perform the following legal services relating to Willow Rancho Street Lighting Assessment District No. 3, City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, State of California.
 - (a) Preparation of all forms of resolutions, notices, affidavits, and other documents required by the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913, including the legal format of the engineer's report required by Section 10204.
 - (b) The preparation of written instructions to Client's Clerk and other staff members concerning the performance of legally required duties.
 - (c) Review of documents prepared by Client's engineering staff or consulting engineers, including boundary map, assessment diagram, assessment roll, and the general provisions of construction specifications.
 - (d) Attendance at the public hearing on the engineer's report (including continuances of the hearing, if any).
 - (e) Attendance at all other public meetings of Client at which matters relating to the assessment district are considered, except routine matters.
 - (f) Attendance at staff meetings or meetings of property owners, upon the request of the Client, after reasonable notice.

- (g) Telephone consultation with staff members and property owners to answer legal questions about the assessment proceedings.
- (h) Preparation of the notice inviting bids and construction contract, if required, and review of contract bonds and insurance documents.
- (i) Arrangements for the printing of improvement bonds to represent unpaid assessments, including the printing of a bond register and, if required, assessment installment notices.
- (j) The preparation of a record of assessment installments for the use of the County Auditor, if required.
- (k) Arrangements for the sale of improvement bonds either by negotiation or by public bid, at the option of Client, including a review of financial disclosure requirements and, if required, the preparation of the notice inviting bond bids.
- (1) The preparation of bond delivery documents.
- (m) The rendition of a legal opinion on the validity of the improvement bonds and the proceedings leading to their issuance.
- (n) Preparation of a transcript of the legal proceedings in loose-leaf form for the use of the Client.
- (o) Preparation of the required reports to the California Debt Advisory Commission (pursuant to Section 8855 et seq. of the Government Code) and to the Internal Revenue Service (pursuant to Section 149 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986).
- 2. The services of Bond Counsel under this agreement shall not include the following:
- (a) Legal services in connection with the acquisition of interests in real property, either through negotiation or through exercise of the power of eminent domain.

- (b) Legal services in connection with litigation. The performance by Bond Counsel of services excluded by this paragraph, if required by Client, shall be under separate oral or written agreement.
 - 3. In consideration of the services set forth in paragraph
- 1, Client shall pay to Bond Counsel the following fee and costs:
 - (a) The legal fee of Bond Counsel shall be a scaled percentage of the amount assessed as set forth in the engineer's report as finally approved under Section 10312 of the Streets and Highways Code.
 - (b) The legal fee of Bond Counsel shall be an amount equal to one and one-half percent (1-1/2%) of that portion of the amount assessed not exceeding \$10 million, plus one-half percent (1/2%) of that portion of the amount assessed exceeding \$10 million but not exceeding \$20 million, plus one-eighth percent (1/8%) of that portion of the amount assessed exceeding \$20 million. The fee shall not be less than \$1500.
 - (c) Costs shall be reimbursed to Bond Counsel as follows:
 - 1) The cost of transportation, meals and lodging.
 - The cost of preparing auditor's record, if required: 7 cents per assessment for each year of the bond issue, with a minimum of \$30.00.
 - The cost of long distance telephone calls: at billed cost.
 - 4) The cost of photocopying: 10 cents per sheet.

The cost of other services for which Bond Counsel makes arrangements under this agreement (such as bond printing costs) shall be billed to the Client and shall be paid by Client directly to the payee.

(d) Payment by Client of the legal fee is contingent upon the levy of assessments and the sale and delivery of improvement bonds representing unpaid assessments in the assessment district. If for any reason, assessments are not confirmed

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and bonds delivered, Bond Counsel shall be paid no legal fee. Both the legal fee and costs are payable upon delivery of the bonds.

4. Bond Counsel certifies that it has no interest, either direct or contingent, in any property or contract arising from or affected by the assessment district, except as Bond Counsel under this agreement. Bond Counsel does not represent any owner of property within the proposed boundaries of this assessment district, and has not received a fee from any source for services connected with the project.

WILLOW RANCHO STREET LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 3

The City Council of the City of Sacramento resolves:

This City Council intends to order the following improvement under the authority of the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913:

A high pressure sodium street lighting system complete, together with all necessary appurtenances for the above described improvements on 64th Avenue from 15th Street to Amherst Street, 65th Avenue from Amherst to 110 feet east of 15th Street, 63rd Avenue from 15th Street to 100 feet west of 15th Street, Amherst Street from 116 feet north of 64th Avenue to 106 feet south of 65th Avenue, and 15th Street from 130 feet south of 65th Avenue to 86 feet south of Tiverton Avenue.

This City Council finds that the land specially benefited by the improvement is shown within the boundaries of the map entitled, "City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, California, Boundary Map of Willow Rancho Street Lighting District No. 3, Showing Proposed Boundaries of the District and the Extent of the Included Lands". This map has been approved by the City Council and is now on file with the City Clerk. The land within the exterior boundaries shown on the map shall be designated Willow Rancho Street Lighting Assessement District No. 3, City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, California.

This City Council intends to levy a special assessment upon the land within the described district in accordance with the special benefit to be received by each parcel of land, respectively, from the improvement. There shall be omitted from special assessment all public streets, alleys and places and all land belonging to the United States, the State of California, the County of Sacramento and this City now in use in the performance of a public function.

Where any disparity occurs in level or size between the improvement and private property, this City Council determines that it is in the public interest and more economical to eliminate the disparity by doing work on the private property instead of adjusting the work on public property. Accordingly, work may be done on private property for this purpose with the written consent of the landowner.

Serial bonds representing unpaid assessments, and bearing interest at a rate not to exceed twelve percent (12%) per annum, will be issued in the manner provided by the Improvement Bond Act of 1915 (Division 10, Streets and Highways Code), and the last installment of the bonds shall mature not to exceed four (4) years from the second day of September next succeeding twelve (12) months from their date.

The City Council will not obligate itself to advance available funds from the City treasury to cure any deficiency which may occur in the bond redemption fund. A determination not to obligate itself shall not prevent the City from, in its sole discretion, so advancing funds.

This City Council appoints the Director of Public Works as Engineer of Work for this project, and directs the preparation of the report required by Section 10204 of the Streets and Highways Code.

In the opinion of this City Council, the public interest will not be served by allowing owners of assessable lands to enter into a contract for the work of improvement as otherwise permitted in Section 20485 of the Public Contract Code.

If any excess shall be realized from the assessment it shall be used, in such amounts as the City Council may determine, in accordance with the provisions of law for one or more of the following purposes:

- (a) Transfer to the general fund of the City, provided that the amount of any such transfer shall not exceed the lesser of \$1,000 or 5% of the total amount expended from the improvement fund;
- (b) As a credit upon the assessment and any supplemental assessment, provided that such surplus may, if the City Council so determines, also be applied as a credit to the City or any local, state or national agency or authority which shall have made a contribution towards the cost and expenses of the acquisitions and improvements in the proportion which such contribution bears to the total amount of the assessment or supplemental assessment prior to the deduction of all such contributions; or
- (c) For the maintenance of the improvements.

The Director of Public Works, Engineer of Work for Willow Rancho Street Lighting Assessment District No. 3 makes this report, as directed by the City Council of the City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, State of California, pursuant to Section 10204 of the Streets and Highways Code (Municipal Improvement Act of 1913).

The improvements which are the subject of this report are briefly described as follows:

A high pressure sodium street lighting system complete; together with all necessary appurtenances for the above described improvements on 64th Avenue from 15th Street to Amherst Street, 65th Avenue from Amherst to 110 feet east of 15th Street, 63rd Avenue from 15th Street to 100 feet west of 15th Street, Amherst Street from 116 feet north of 64th Avenue to 106 feet south of 65th Avenue, and 15th Street from 130 feet south of 65th Avenue to 86 feet south of Tiverton Avenue.

Serial bonds representing unpaid assessments, and bearing interest at a rate not to exceed twelve percent (12%) per annum, shall be issued in the manner provided by the Improvement Bond Act of 1915 (Division 10, Streets and Highways Code), and the last installment of the bonds shall mature not to exceed four (4) years from the second day of September next succeeding twelve (12) months from their date.

This report includes the following attached exhibits:

EXHIBIT A - Plans and specifications for improvements to be constructed. Plans and specifications are a part of this report whether or not separately bound.

EXHIBIT B - An estimate of the cost of the improvements.

EXHIBIT C - An assessment roll, showing the amount proposed to be specially assessed against each parcel of real property within this assessment district. WILLOW RANCHO STREET LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 3

At 7:30 P.M. on June 28, 1988, at the Planning Commission Chambers, 1231 "I" Street, Floor 1, Sacramento, California, the City Council will hold a protest hearing on the Resolution of Intention (adopted May 10, 1988), and the Engineer's Report for Willow Rancho Street Lighting Assessment District No. 3, City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, California. The purpose of the hearing is to receive and consider protests against the proposed improvement, the extent of the assessment district, or the proposed assessment.

The proposed improvement is briefly described as follows:

A high pressure sodium street lighting system complete; together with all necessary appurtenances for the above described improvements on 64th Avenue from 15th Street to Amherst Street, 65th Avenue from Amherst to 110 feet east of 15th Street, 63rd Avenue from 15th Street to 100 feet west of 15th Street, Amherst Street from 116 feet north of 64th Avenue to 106 feet south of 65th Avenue, and 15th Street from 130 feet south of 65th Avenue to 86 feet south of Tiverton Avenue.

The total estimated cost of the proposed improvement is \$51,247.68.
