**SUBJECT: APPROVE THE PARK NAME OF STEVE JONES PARK AND APPROVE
THE PARK MASTER PLAN CIP (PN: LW06).**

SUMMARY:

Steve Jones Park is a 6.5- acre park/ detention basin located at 24TH Street & Casa Linda Drive in South Sacramento. This report requests City Council's approval of the park name of Steve Jones Park and the approval of the park master plan.



COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

The naming of Steve Jones Park was reviewed and approved by the Citizen's Advisory Committee for Parks and Recreation on November 4, 2004. The master plan for the park was reviewed and approved on May 6, 2004 (Exhibit A, page 7).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On November 27, 2001, City Council approved a naming policy for all City facilities. This policy allows a park, parkway or open space to be named for 'an individual or family who has contributed significantly to the community or facility.' The procedure for naming a park, include receiving a recommendation from the community.

For this park site the community asked if a park naming contest be held to name the park in the Buena Park subdivision. The City of Sacramento held a park naming contest and thirty-one name suggestions were submitted by the community. Three members of the Meadowview Neighborhood Association and two members of the Meadowview Development Committee reviewed the naming contest entries. The five-member panel selected the final name, Steve Jones Park on April 29, 2004.

Steve A. Jones was born on December 11, 1966 in Susanville, California. Steve Jones was an accomplished athlete having earned the title of California State 100 Meter Champion, Football All American and Track and Field All American while attending Luther Burbank High School. See Exhibit C, page 8.

The master plan for the 6.5-acre park / detention basin was created through the public participation process. Parks and Recreation held two community workshops to create the master plan. On January 21, 2004 the community approved the master plan with no changes.

The Master Plan includes basic landscaping, children's play area, open turf, group picnic area, future sports court, nature area, and a full size soccer field in the detention basin or two bantam soccer fields. Currently there is no development schedule for phase one pending project budget funds.

The park was master planned to include the Maintainable Park Standards saving techniques. At least 20% of the site is designed with urban forest, non-irrigated native grasses and mulch.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

This report requests approval for the park name and park master plan only. There are no financial considerations with this report. Financial impacts will be reported when staff returns to City Council for approval of the park development phase. It is anticipated that this park will be funded using park development impact fees (PIF) and possibly SHRA funds. Staff will also work with the Department of Utilities about funding part of the park. Current PIF fees for a single-family unit are \$4,277. A neighborhood park should generate \$336,500 per acre in fees. Based on those fees, to fully develop the 6.5-acres is estimated to cost \$2,187,250.

There will be approximately \$52,000 per year in ongoing operational and maintenance costs, which includes \$39,000 per year in park maintenance, and \$13,000 per year water and utility costs.

The Neighborhood Park Maintenance Community Facilities District (CFD) was established to reduce reliance on the general fund for neighborhood park maintenance and to preserve the level of maintenance in the parks system. It was projected that revenues from the CFD would provide approximately 65-70% of the cost associated with maintaining new neighborhood parks for those areas that annex to the District.

Since some areas have not annexed to the District, the percentage of costs covered will fall below the 65-70% level. The balance of costs must be borne by the Citywide Landscape and Lighting District and other city funds. It is anticipated that significant revenues from the CFD will not begin until 2005. In the meantime, maintenance funds must be derived from other sources.

Existing parks and all community parks, regional parks, open space, trails and buffer areas are not covered by the CFD.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Staff will prepare all necessary environmental review provisions for this master plan as required under the California Environmental Quality Act in the future.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

This action is consistent with City Council's goal to expand park and recreational opportunities.

ESBD EFFORTS:

No goods or services are being purchased in association with this report.
