

HONORABLE CITY COMMISSION,

CITY OF SACRAMENTO,

JUNE 25th, 1921.

The Honorable City Commission met in Adjourned Meeting on this date at 10.10 o'clock A.M., President Bliss presiding, and Roll Call being answered by the following Commissioners:

Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Haynes, Turner.

Commissioner Carmichael arrived later.

----- At request of City Clerk, reading of Minutes of Regular Meeting June 23rd, and Adjourned Meeting June 24th, 1921, was dispensed with.

----- Upon recommendation of Commissioner of Public Health & Safety, Commissioner Haynes moved that leave of absence be granted William M. Hallanan, Detective in Police Department, for period of three days, with permission to leave the State of California, for the reason that said Hallanan was returning a prisoner to City of Sacramento. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Haynes, Turner.

Absent: Commissioner Carmichael.

----- Upon recommendation of Commissioner of Public Health & Safety, Commissioner Turner moved that Pool Room License be granted W. Watamura, 1207 Third Street. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes, and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Haynes, Turner.

Absent: Commissioner Carmichael.

----- City Attorney presented with form approved, deed from Herman T. Silvius and Alma J. Silvius to City of Sacramento for south 50 feet of north 110 feet of Lot 1, Block I and J, 10th & 11th Streets.

Commissioner Haynes moved that City Clerk be directed to record said deed. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Haynes, Turner.

Absent: Commissioner Carmichael.

----- Upon recommendation of Commissioner of Public Works, deed received from Elliot & Atkinson, signed by Charles E. Wright, for right of way for water mains crossing Lot 581 in Wright & Kimbrough Subdivision 19, was referred to City Attorney.

----- Following communication was received:

----- A communication from the Committee on Rodeo at Livermore on dates of July 2, 3 and 4, 1921 extending invitation for attending said Rodeo, was referred to the Incoming Council.

----- A communication from the Commandant of 12th Naval District, relative to light warcraft

appearing at celebration of 4th of July in City of Sacramento, was referred to President of Commission.

----- A communication was received from W. L. Hack, Assistant Division Superintendent of Southern Pacific Company, calling attention to repairs need to municipal spur track at Front & J Streets.

Ordered filed.

Commissioner Turner moved that matter be referred to Commissioner of Public Works with power to act. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes, and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Haynes, Turner.

Absent: Commissioner Carrichael.

----- Two protests against opening and widening of M Street, 37th and 38th Streets, were received and referred to Commissioner of Streets.

----- Resolutions adopted by McKinley Improvement Club, requesting Real Estate Firm to reconsider sale of property to Orientals, was received and ordered filed.

----- Charles Longton, addressed Commission, stating that he had been mis-represented in statements made by property owners, relative to establishment of Lighting District No. 9, and subject was discussed at length, no action being taken by City Commission, pending opinion of City Attorney.

----- Communication from Coast Construction Company, relative to extra work by said Company, was discussed at length, Resident Engineer Gillespie and Bayly Hipkins, President of Coast Construction Company, addressing Commission on subject matter, and no action was taken by City Commission, matter being postponed until meeting of June 28th, 1921.

----- Commission adjourned at 11.52 o'clock A.M.
