

SUMMARY

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WILLIAM G. SELINE

Attached is a resolution by which you approve the Capital Improvements Program for 1980 and 1981. At the request of your Budget and Finance Committee, four items are subject to further review. These items are (1) Parking Garage, 4-5-J-K, (2) Replacement of exhaust fans, Garage K, (3) Underpass to Old Sacramento, and (4) K Street Mall Street Lighting, 4th to 6th Streets. The resolution provides for such further review.

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BACKGROUND AND FINANCIAL DATA

FILED

Attached are a financial summary, two schedules and supporting documentation setting forth the capital improvements SACRAMENTO REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY recommended for construction during 1980 and 1981. Nothing is scheduled beyond 1981. The federally-funded downtown projects (Projects 3 and 4) are currently designated by the Department of Housing and Urban Development for financial close-out of federally-funded aspects by December 31, 1980. We do not believe this date is realistic as the following majoritems must occur prior to federal close-out:

We shall be asking for an extension to December 31, 1981 soon.

The attached cost projections are based upon a cost cutoff date of December 31, 1981, with final federal financial settlement by June 30, 1982. Interest costs have been projected to June 30, 1982, as shown in attached schedules. Any substantial increase in any of the remaining "Needed to Complete Project" line items will necessitate either a reduction in other line items or in the need for other source(s) of funds. Early sale of the parcels listed above would improve the financial picture for Project 3 by reducing the federal loan outstanding and thereby either reducing interest costs or increasing interest income, depending on the timing of the sale. Some provision of other funds (Emergency Reserve, to be repaid eventually from tax increments) has been made in forecasts of expenditures of local funds.

APPROVING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM FOR 1980 AND 1981

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

Section 1. The Capital Improvements Program for 1980 totalling \$10,512,340 and for 1981 totalling \$6,066,000 is hereby approved.

Section 2. The following items are subject to further review prior to final approval: (1) Parking Garage, 4-5-J-K,

(2) Replacement of exhaust fans, Garage K, (3) Underpass to Old Sacramento, and (4) K Street Mall Street Lighting, 4th to 6th Streets.
