SUBJECT: UPARR Grant Program: Fund Development Program

SUMMARY

It is proposed that the City Council approve submittal of a grant application to the National Park Service for Urban Park and Recreation Recovery Program (UPARR) funding, to finance a Fund Development Program.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Urban Park and Recreation Recovery Program provides funds to develop local Recovery Action Programs designed to revitalize parks and recreational facilities. Particular emphasis is on encouraging private sector support, systematic planning at the local level including widespread citizen involvement, and the development of linkages with non-municipal area recreation and service providers. These Federal grants are allocated on a competitive basis.

The City Council in March 1982 approved the submittal of a UPARR Program grant application for funds to develop a Park Facilities and Recreation Services Master Plan designed to update the Parks/Recreation Element of the General Plan. An \$88,000 grant was received enabling the City to develop the 1984 Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan which was adopted by the City Council on May 29, 1984. Having been hailed by the National Park Service as one of the finest master plans since the inception of the UPARR program, the plan is currently being disseminated as a planning model nationwide.

This master plan update clearly indicates the need to secure supplemental support funds, particularly through private sponsorships, grants, donations and bequests in order to ensure adequate financial resources for the continued provision of quality parks and recreation facilities and services. A Fund Development Program designed to both develop and implement funding strategies is

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necessary to realize the mandates of the Master Plan. Application for Federal funding under the UPARR program in the form of a second level Recovery Action Program grant is appropriate for this project. Preliminary discussions with National Park Service representatives have been positive and the response to this concept is supportive. The City Council has previously indicated their support of this program by budgeting \$57,200 for the Development Officer position.

FINANCIAL DATA

The estimated total cost of the Fund Development Program is \$107,200. The City staff proposes to apply for \$50,000 under the Federal UPARR Grant Program which will be matched by \$57,200 from the City General Fund. \$57,200 has been appropriated in the Department's FY 1984-85 budget.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council approve, by resolution, the submittal of the application for a UPARR Program Grant to aid in financing the Fund Development Program.

WHEREAS, the Congress under Title X of Public Law 95-625 has authorized the establishment of a Federal Urban Park and Recreation Recovery Grant-In-Aid Program, providing matching funds to local urban governments for the rehabilitation of deteriorated recreation facilities; and

WHEREAS, the National Park Service is responsible for the administration of the program, setting up necessary rules and procedures governing application by local governments under the program; and

WHEREAS, said procedures adopted by the National Park Service require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications and the availability of local matching funds prior to submission of said applications; and

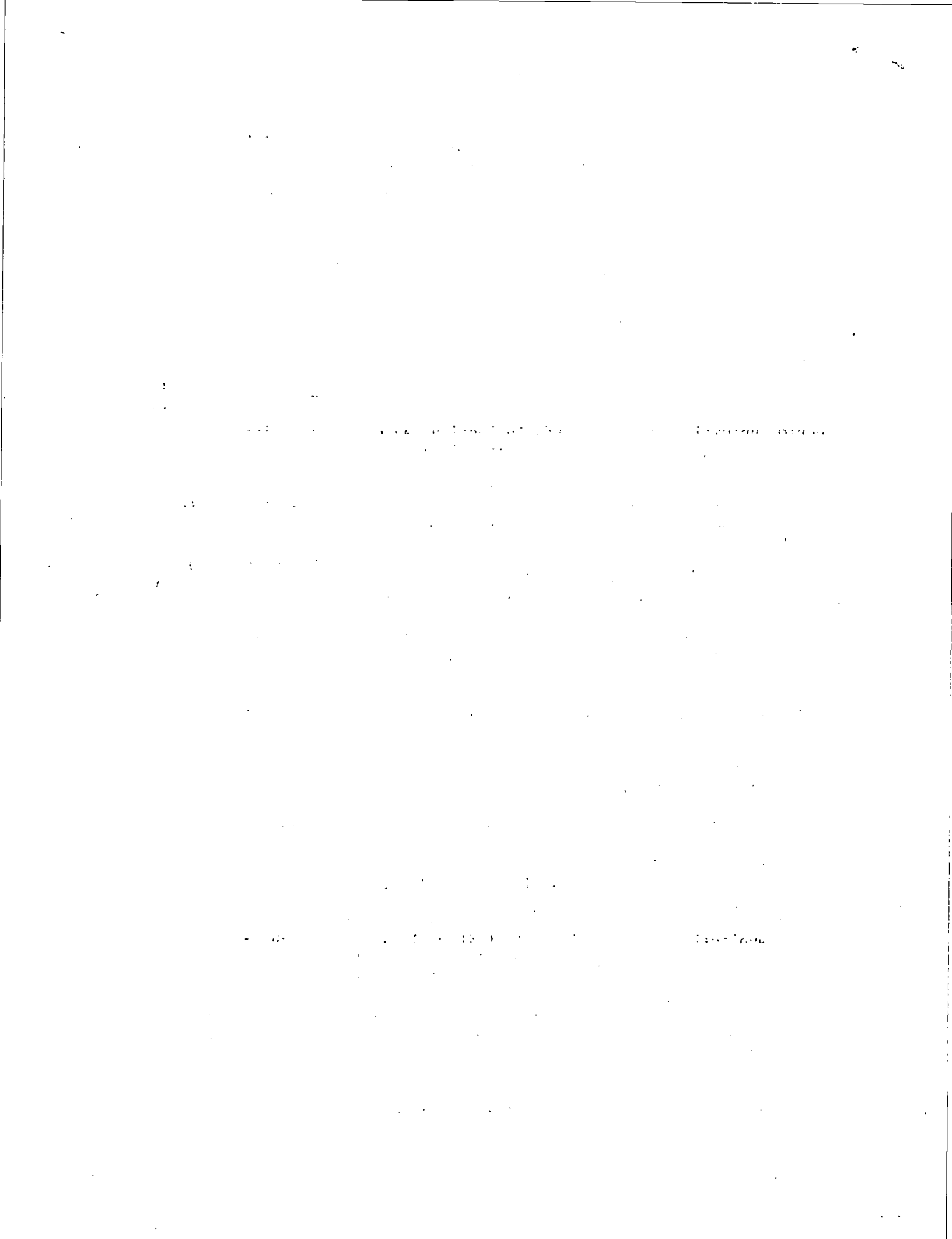
WHEREAS, Part V of said applications contains assurances that the applicant must comply with; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project for development of a recreational services/facilities master plan is consistent with the California Outdoor Recreation Resources Plan; and

WHEREAS, the project must be compatible with the land use plans of those jurisdictions immediately surrounding the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council hereby:

1. Approves the filing of an application for Urban Park and Recreation Recovery Program fund assistance; and
2. Certifies that said agency understands the assurances in Part V of the application and certifies that it will comply with the regulations, policies, guidelines, and requirements, including A-95, FMC-74-4, and FMC 74-7, as they relate to the application; and
3. Certifies that said agency has matching funds from local funding sources and can finance 100 percent of the project, 50 percent of which will be reimbursed; and
4. Certifies that the project is compatible with the land use plans of those jurisdictions immediately surrounding the project; and



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5. Certifies that the project included in this application conforms to the Parks/Recreation Element of the City's General Plan; and
6. Appoints the City Manager as agent of the applicant to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to, application, agreements, amendments, payment requests, and so on which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.
