SUMMARY:

This is a report to the City Council describing the activity of members of the Sacramento Police Department at a demonstration at City Hall on 7-15-80 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

I understand that participants have complained that members of the Police Department were taking pictures of people involved in the demonstration.

The Police Department had several officers at City Hall during this event. These officers were in plain clothes and were present only as observers. None of these officers had a camera and they saw no pictures taken by any members of this Department.

The officers in plain clothes were assigned to observe the demonstration, as is our normal procedure for any sort of demonstration held at City Hall. Their function is to observe and report any problems that might need immediate attention. The safety of everyone has to be preserved and these officers are to report any disturbances or threats of danger to the demonstrators or to anyone else in the vicinity. We did not change any of our procedures for this rally and the presence of the assigned officers was normal for this sort of activity.

Investigation of the statement that pictures were taken of the demonstrators revealed that pictures were taken by a District Attorney's investigator. The investigator properly identified himself to the officers on the paddy wagon and asked to take the pictures from the vicinity of the vehicle. The reason for the picture taking is unknown to this Department.

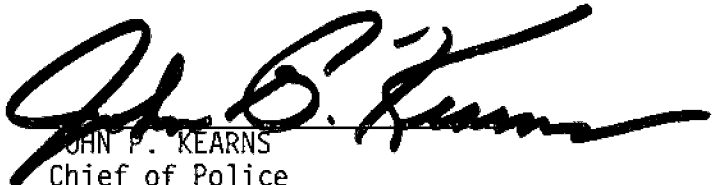

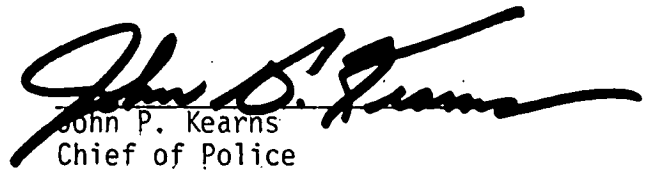
