Attached is a Resolution whereby you authorize the Executive Director to renew Cooperative Purchasing Agreements with the following elderly nutrition programs for the purchase of disposable products used in their operations during FY 1980-81:

> Serve Our Seniors, Inc. Sacramento Concilio, Inc. Inter-Tribal Council of California, Inc. League of United Latin American Citizens Sacramento Area Economic Opportunity Council

#### BACKGROUND

In 1976, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors mandated that all elderly nutrition programs utilizing County funds to serve the senior citizens of Sacramento County would pool their resources in the cooperative purchase of paper goods for the purpose of reducing costs. The Sacramento Elderly Nutrition Program (SENP) was directed by the Board to develop and administer the cooperative purchasing program.

Since its inception nearly three years ago, the program has successfully demonstrated substantial cost savings to all the participating programs through bulk purchase of most of the disposable paper and plastic products used by the various elderly nutrition programs in the County.

The agencies presently participating in the program are Serve Our Seniors, Inc. (SOS), Sacramento Concilio, Inc. (La Casita Program), Inter-Tribal Council of California, Inc., the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC), the Sacramento Area Economic Opportunity Council (SAEOC), and the Sacramento Elderly Nutrition Program (SENP) which does the purchasing and operates the central warehouse.

The renewed Agreements would cover the period from July 1, 1980 through June 30, 1981.

### FINANCIAL DATA

Paper products are purchased by SENP and are transferred to other programs at cost, plus an administrative charge of 12% of the total, if the products are delivered by SENP, or 10%, if the program picks up its own order.

This resolution involves no additional staff or expenditures.

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO RENEW THE COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD FROM JULY 1, 1980 THROUGH JUNE 30, 1981, FOR THE PURCHASE OF DISPOSABLE PRODUCTS USED BY ELDERLY NUTRITION PROGRAMS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

Section 1. The Executive Director is authorized to execute those certain Cooperative Purchasing Agreements for the purchase of disposable products with Serve Our Seniors, Inc., Sacramento Concilio, Inc., the Inter Tribal Council of California, Inc., the League of United Latin American Citizens, and the Sacramento Area Economic Opportunity Council, for the period from July 1, 1980 through June 30, 1981.

Section 2. The Sacramento Elderly Nutrition Program shall be responsible for the purchasing, warehousing, and distribution of the paper goods to the cooperative agencies named in Section 1 of the Resolution.

Section 3. The cooperating agencies shall be supplied paper goods at cost plus 12% of the total if the goods are delivered, or 10% of the total if the goods are picked up at the SENP warehouse.
