

ORDINANCE NO. 743, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 90 OF ORDINANCE NO. 18, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED SEPTEMBER 22nd, 1921, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE CARRYING ON OF CERTAIN PROFESSIONS, TRADES, CALLINGS AND OCCUPATIONS: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND MAKING THAT AN EMERGENCY MEASURE, TO TAKE EFFECT OCTOBER 1st, 1921."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. Section 90 of Ordinance No. 18, Fourth Series, passed September 22nd, 1921, is hereby amended to read as follows:-

CARNIVALS AND STREET FAIRS:

SECTION 90. For every person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of conducting a fair or carnival, the license therefor shall be \$200.00 for the first day, and \$100.00 for each additional day.


Provided, however, that no portion of any public street or other public place of the City of Sacramento shall ever be used for the purpose of conducting any such fair or carnival.


Provided, further, that no license hereunder shall be issued until evidence has been submitted to the License Bureau that the said person, firm or corporation applying for a license has the ability to respond in damages resulting from the ownership or operation of devices used by said person, firm or corporation and arising by reason of personal injury to, or death of, any one person, of at least \$25,000.00 and subject to the limit of \$25,000.00 for each person injured or killed, of at least \$50,00.00 for such injury to, or death of, two or more persons in any one accident, and for damages to property (in excess of \$100.00) of at least \$1,000.00 resulting from any one accident.

Such proof of ability to respond in damages may be given as follows: The written certificate or certificates of any insurance carrier duly authorized to do business within this state, that it issued to or for the benefit of the said person, firm or corporation named therein, a public liability policy in lawful form in the limits above named covering damages arising out of the use and operation of devices owned or used by said person, firm or corporation, and that said policy is, and will be, during the period of such license, in full force and effect.
