

Dear Mayor Isenberg:

The terms of the current members of the Sacramento Overall Economic Development Program Committee are due to expire June 30, 1981. Now would be the normal time to begin the process of soliciting committee membership requests for consideration by the City Council and the Board of Supervisors. However, as you are aware, the President's economic program calls for the elimination of the Economic Development Administration effective September 30, 1981. Should that occur, the current committee staff support provided by the County Office of Economic Development would no longer be available.

At the request of the Sacramento Overall Economic Development Program Committee, I am recommending that the terms of the current members be extended for a three month period to September 30, 1981. As we approach that date there will be a clearer picture of EDA funding and the future role of the SOEDPC. I believe it is important for potential members to understand the SOEDPC role and the commitment required before they apply for appointment. I am sending a similar letter to Illa Collin, Chairperson, Board of Supervisors. I would appreciate it if you would bring this matter before the City Council for their consideration. Please do not hesitate to call me if I can be of any assistance.
