



SUBJECT: Authorization to Enter into Various Contracts to
Implement the Transitional Housing Program

SUMMARY

On October 8, 1985 you authorized the Executive Director to apply to the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA) for \$152,000 in Community Services Block Grant monies. The purpose of this application was to continue the implementation of the Transitional Housing Program (THP). The Agency was subsequently awarded \$105,827.00 for the program. Staff recommends accepting this money and recommends that the Executive Director be authorized to enter into all contracts necessary to implement the THP.

BACKGROUND

This Agency has acted as a lead Agency since March, 1985 with a group of non-profit agencies known as the Transitional Housing Consortium. The members of this consortium are Lutheran Social Services, the Interfaith Service Bureau, Galt Concilio, South Area Emergency Housing Center, Travelers Aid Society and this Agency. The Consortium provides a continuum of services to homeless families to assist them in resolving the problems which have led to their homelessness. Funding from a variety of sources such as FEMA funds, and contributions by the non-profits themselves. The Program itself, known as the Transitional Housing Program (THP) has been successful with 80% of the families served. The SETA grant allows us to serve more families and to add additional services such as home management training and budgeting skills.

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FINANCIAL DATA

SETA has already awarded \$105,827 to the Consortium with this Agency as the responsible fiscal agency through which all parties are paid.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

No basic change from current policy.

VOTE AND RECOMMENDATION OF COMMISSION


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RECOMMENDATIONS

AUTHORIZING VARIOUS ACTIONS FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF CSBG FUNDS AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Sacramento City Council authorized the Executive Director to apply to the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency for Community Services Block Grant funds to implement the Transitional Housing Program; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

Section 1: The City Council authorizes the Executive Director to accept the \$105,827 in Community Services Block Grant funds from the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency to implement the Transitional Housing Program.

Section 2: The City Council further authorizes the Executive Director to act as agent for the City and to enter into all other agreements necessary to implement the Transitional Housing Program, including those with Lutheran Social Services, the Interfaith Services Bureau, Galt Concilio, South Area Emergency Housing Center and the Travelers' Aid Society.
