SUBJECT: RESOLUTION SUPPORTING HR 5057 (FAZIO AND MATSUI)

SUMMARY

Congressmen Fazio and Matsui have jointly introduced HR 5057 to authorize construction of a flood control project to protect areas along the lower American River and the Natomas area. The bill provides for an expandable flood control dam at Auburn, for levee work in Natomas and other areas, and for delaying implementation of the revised FEMA Flood Control Maps for a period of five year.

The Congressmen are attempting to secure passage of HR 5057 before the end of the current session of Congress and have requested that the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors and the City Council adopt resolutions in support of the legislation. The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors adopted such a resolution on August 16, 1988.

The legislation is consistent with the resolution adopted by the City Council on January 19, 1988, concerning flood protection along the American River and in the Natomas area. The City Council has approved a cost sharing agreement for the feasibility study for the project authorized in HR 5057. This feasibility study is currently underway by the Corps of Engineers. The City Council has also supported SB 1604 by Senator Garamendi to create the Sacramento Regional Flood Control and Drainage District, which will be empowered to provide the local share of the non-federal costs of a project envisioned in HR 5057.

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution supporting HR 5057.

FINANCIAL

There is no financial impact in adopting the resolution supporting HR 5057. However, there will be financial impacts related to the local share of the implementation of the flood control project authorized in this bill. The exact amount of these costs are not known at this time.

WHEREAS, Congressmen Fazio and Matsui have jointly introduced HR 5057 to authorize construction of a flood control project to protect areas along the Sacramento River, Lower American River and the Natomas Area, to authorize a flood control dam at Auburn expandable in the future to help meet hydroelectric power and local water supply needs, and to delay implementation of revised flood hazard maps for the area for a period of five years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, on January 19, 1988, adopted a resolution supporting flood protection along the American River and in Natomas which included recognition of an expandable flood control dam upstream of Folsom Reservoir; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has approved a cost sharing agreement with the State of California for feasibility studies in the American River Watershed; and

WHEREAS, the City Council supported Senate Bill 1604 (Garamendi) to create the Sacramento Regional Flood Control and Drainage District as the vehicle to fund construction of flood control improvements such as those provided for in HB 5057.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council supports HR 5057 and the provisions for an expandable flood control dam at Auburn; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council, through the Sacramento Regional Flood Control and Drainage District, support appropriate funding means to pay the local non-federal share of project costs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk be directed to forward copies of this resolution to Senators Cranston and Wilson, Congressmen Fazio and Matsui, members of the California Congressional delegation, members of the County's delegation to the State Legislature, and other appropriate Boards, Commissions, and state, local, and federal agencies.
