**SUBJECT: OPEN AN APPLICATION PERIOD FOR THE

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: Citywide.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that an application period be opened for the Sacramento Disabilities Advisory Commission to fill four (4) positions. This opening represents two term expirations and two seats whereby appointees resigned prior to the expiration of their terms. Appointees shall be City of Sacramento residents who have experience with disability issues and/or knowledge or experience with disability law (e.g. ADA or Title 24).

APPOINTMENT: The Commission shall be comprised of nine (9) members who reside within the City of Sacramento, appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. The Commission's membership shall be representative of different disability groups including, but not limited to, physical, sensory, developmental and mental disabilities. Appointees shall have experience with disability issues, knowledge or experience with disability law, such as ADA, or Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations.

TERM: Three (3) years. Two term limit applies. A member appointed to complete an unexpired term shall be eligible to serve up to two (2) consecutive terms in addition to the unexpired term.

MEETING INFO: Regular meetings shall be held on the third Thursday of the month, from 6:00 to 8:00pm., unless otherwise noticed. Verify meeting time and location with contact persons, Carol Bradley or Ken Fleming.

COMPENSATION: \$50 per meeting attended, not to exceed \$100 for any month.

POWERS & DUTIES:

1. Serve as an advisory body to the City regarding compliance with federal and state disability laws. The Commission shall not advise the City concerning litigation or administrative proceedings to which the City is a party;
2. Review policies, programs and activities within the City as they affect persons with disabilities;
3. Recommend procedures for City employees with disabilities to request and receive reasonable accommodations;
4. Provide information, referral, and technical assistance to the City in matters pertaining to disability issues;
5. Establish a liaison with the City's ADA Coordinators to assist with policies, procedures and programs as they relate to federal and state disability laws.
