**SUBJECT: Citizens Advisory Committee Appointments**

**SUMMARY**

This report recommends that Council approve the appointment of five Citizens Advisory Committee members for new two-year terms.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

As an element of the 1984 Council-adopted Master Plan for Park Facilities and Recreational Services, a Citizens Advisory Committee was established in May of 1986. The Citizens Advisory Committee provides a means for the interpretation of public opinion to the Department staff. The committee consists of one representative from each of the eleven planning areas and three at-large representatives. The term of appointment for five members expired in May, 1990. Recruitment for the four vacant positions began in March, 1990 and interviews were conducted in early June.

Recruitment of committee members was done through news releases, advertisements in neighborhood newsletters, and the City Clerk's office. These efforts resulted in thirteen applications. All applicants were invited to be interviewed. Interviews were conducted by the Parks and Recreation Division City Wide Manager, after which four candidates were selected by the Director of Parks and Community Services to serve on the Advisory Committee, pending Council approval.

No applications have been received for Planning Area 8 (North Sacramento). The Department will continue to solicit applications for this area.

SUBJECT: Citizens Advisory Committee Appointments

SUMMARY

This report recommends that Council approve the appointment of five Citizens Advisory Committee members for the new two-year term.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Citizens Advisory Committee provides a means for the participation of public opinion to the Department staff. It is recommended that the City Council, by resolution, approve the four individuals appointed by the Director of Parks and Community Services to serve on the Citizens Advisory Committee.


