

ORDINANCE NO. 724, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 4, 6 AND 8 OF ORDINANCE NO. 702, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED JUNE 11 1936, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND REGULATING THE HOURS OF BUSINESS WHEN UNCURED AND UNCOOKED MEATS ARE SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE, RECEIVED, DELIVERED OR HANDLED, AND PRESCRIBING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 167, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED APRIL 24, 1930, AND ORDINANCE NO. 482, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED AUGUST 7, 1930."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO :

SECTION 1. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 702, Fourth Series, passed June 11 1936, is hereby amended to read as follows:-

SECTION 4. Upon the filing of such application with the said Health Department of the City of Sacramento, a duly authorized Meat Inspector of the City of Sacramento shall inspect said premises and, if same shall be found to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, and any other ordinance under the supervision of the Health Department, including hot water facilities located adjacent to sales room, he shall make a written report thereof to the Health Department, whereupon the City Health Department shall issue the permit applied for in writing and cause a record thereof to be kept in said department.


SECTION 2. Section 6 of said Ordinance No. 702, Fourth Series, is hereby amended to read as follows:-

SECTION 6. Every place of business or department of a place of business where uncured or uncooked meats are sold or offered for sale must be equipped with a cooler, refrigerator or an icebox and/or display case approved by the Health Officer and maintained at a temperature not to exceed 45 degrees Fahrenheit with sufficient circulation of air and be connected indirectly with the sewer in all cases where a nuisance exists at time of inspection due to faulty drainage disposal, and in all new installation, same to comply with the plumbing laws of the City of Sacramento.

SECTION 3. Section 8 of Ordinance No. 702, Fourth Series, is hereby amended to read as follows:-

SECTION 8. It shall be unlawful to deliver or to receive at any place of business in the City of Sacramento any uncured or uncooked meats for the purpose of sale or delivery as uncured or uncooked meat to any consumer, other than carcasses of meat or portions thereof, bearing the inspection stamp of the United States Department of Agriculture, or the inspection stamp of the California State Department of Agriculture, or the inspection stamp of any municipal Health Department, California approved. A memorandum of sale, properly dated and containing the name of the dealer delivering meats, shall accompany the meats so delivered.
