SUBJECT: Sacramento County Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Prevention Education Program - Contract

SUMMARY

The County Office of Education has received \$678,316 in Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Prevention Education grant funds to implement a comprehensive plan targeting 4th, 5th and 6th grade students. The grant requires joint implementation with law enforcement agencies.

Grant revenues allocated for use by the Sacramento Police Department total \$34,762. The Police Department proposes to train six officers to work in the schools on an overtime basis. They will instruct the curriculum currently in use in the Partners in Prevention (PIP) program. Approximately 700 additional students in the City of Sacramento will receive drug prevention training as a result of this funding. Existing police services will not be impacted by utilizing officers on an overtime basis.

It is recommended that the City Manager be authorized to sign the Assurances Cover Sheet and the subsequent contract with the Sacramento County Office of Education. It is also recommended that the Police Department's budget be augmented by \$34,762.

BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill 1087 (Chapter 92, Statutes of 1989) mandates a Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Prevention Education (CADPE) component for the Suppression of Drug Abuse in Schools Program, administered in a collaborative effort by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP), the State Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs and the State Department of Education. The goal of the program is to prevent alcohol and drug abuse through a comprehensive approach involving the partnership of school districts and law enforcement agencies. Only county superintendents of schools are eligible to apply for CADPE funding. Public school districts are required to enter into an agreement with local law enforcement for joint implementation of the project.

The Sacramento County Office of Education was awarded \$678,316 in grant funds for the CADPE component of the Suppression of Drugs in Schools Program. Program components require that projects target 4th, 5th and 6th grade students. A Local Coordinating Council (LCC) assisted in developing and implementing the county-wide implementation plan. The LCC membership included the County Drug and/or Alcohol Administrator, law enforcement representatives, school district governing board members, school district administrators, school faculty, parents, and drug prevention and intervention program executives.

The LCC met to calculate funding for each school district and law enforcement agency in the County of Sacramento. One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) was allocated for law enforcement. The amount allocated to each of the five law enforcement agencies in the county was based on the number of 4th, 5th and 6th grade students within their respective jurisdictions, supplemented by \$1500 for each school in the district having 25% or more of their students as recipients of AFDC grants. The Sacramento Police Department allocation is \$34,762.

The Sacramento Police Department proposes to utilize the program funds to expand the Partners in Prevention (PIP) program currently being taught in Sacramento City Schools. There are insufficient funds to hire one full-time equivalent police officer. Additionally, it is not presently known if the funds will be available in future years. The Police Department proposes to utilize the available funds to train six (6) police officers in the "Here's Looking at You" curriculum currently being used in the PIP program in the Sacramento City Unified School District.

The officers will teach on an overtime basis, for a maximum of two hours per day. An additional six officers will enable the Police Department to provide PIP training to 20 additional classes, or approximately 700 additional students by June 1990. It is also our intent to train bi-lingual officers in this program to fill this current unmet need. Utilizing officers on an overtime basis will allow us to provide instructors for this very important prevention effort without impacting other department services.

#### FINANCIAL DATA

The County Office of Education has allocated \$34,762 to the Sacramento Police Department from the CADPE grant funds. This award is for the period from January 1, 1990 to September 30, 1990. Although it is anticipated that additional funds will be available in the future, it is not yet known how much or when they will be available.

The average cost for a police officer, per hour of overtime including benefits, is \$37.00.

The amount of revenue generated from the Sacramento County Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Prevention Program is \$34,762 and will offset the augmentation to the Police Department's budget.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A  
CONTRACT WITH THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION  
TO PROVIDE AN ALCOHOL AND DRUG PREVENTION EDUCATION PROGRAM  
WITHIN GRAMMAR SCHOOLS IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, a contract with the Sacramento County Office of Education to provide an alcohol and drug prevention education program within grammar schools in the City of Sacramento.
2. Said Contract will remain in effect until September 30, 1990.
3. The General Fund Revenue Budget (101-210-2159-3698) for fiscal year 89/90 is amended to include an additional \$34,762 from the Sacramento County Office of Education.
4. The General Fund Administrative Contingency is increased by \$34,762 due to the revenue from the Sacramento County Office of Education (101-710-7012-4999).
5. The General Fund Administrative Contingency (101-710-7012-4999) is reduced to transfer \$31,968 to the Patrol Division, Mid Shift-North (101-210-2128-4170) and \$2,794 to Office of Administrative Services, Community Resources Section (101-210-2159-4411) to provide Police Officers and supplies for the alcohol and drug prevention program.
